Contract Bridge

THE DEFENSE SLIPS

Today's deal caused quite a furor in the club game in which it occurred.

South dealer
North-South vulnerable.

♠ 9
♥ A 7 5 4 2
♦ 10 9 6 2
♣ 6

♠ K 10 8
♥ Q 4 3
♦ A K J 7
♣ 4

The bidding:
South West North East

1 ♠ 2 ♣ Pass 2NT (1)

4 ♠ Pass 3 ♣ Pass

5 ♠ 6 ♣ Dble. Pass

6 ♣ Dble. Pass Pass

Pass

Obviously enough, the bidding was fast and furious! East's psychic two notrump lured his partner into doubling four spades, but when South coolly went to five

spades on the next round, West caught on and now decided to sacrifice at six clubs. South could not resist the temptation to bid once more in search of the vulnerable slam, and this time West was convinced that his double would stand up.

The double should have stood up, but West himself made an egregious error. He opened the club king and on sight of dummy shifted to a trump. So far so good, but when South then proceeded to run off all eight trumps, West made a fatal error in discarding.

He let go all his clubs, which was sensible enough, but when he ran out of that suit, he released the three and four of diamonds—his obvious thought being that he must guard hearts at all costs.

South had carefully unblocked the ten and nine of diamonds from dummy; now when he laid down the diamond ace and dropped West's queens, the situation was clear. He led to the heart ace and returned the diamond six. The defense against the jack to his own king-eight was marked, and when it succeeded the small slam was home.
