

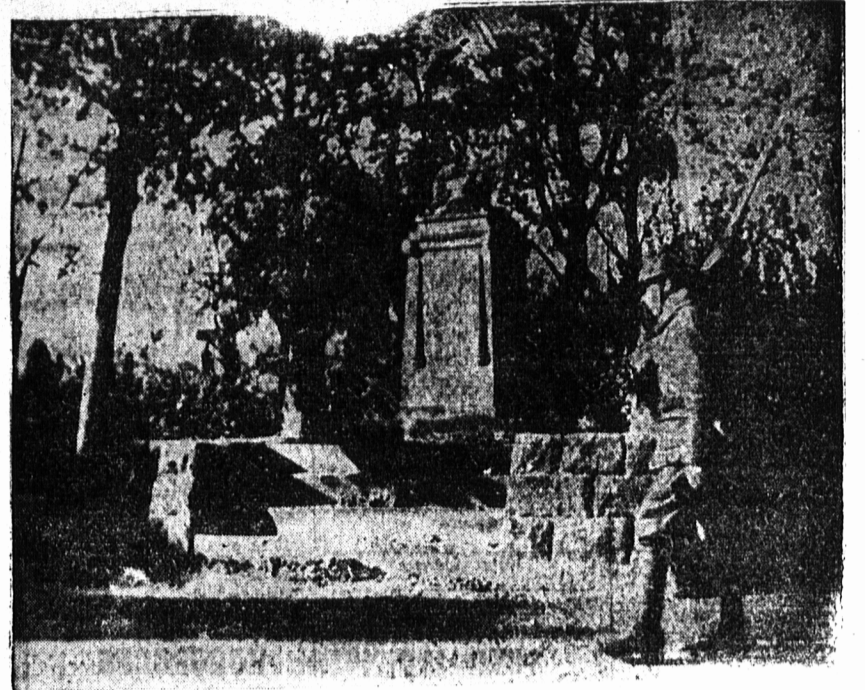

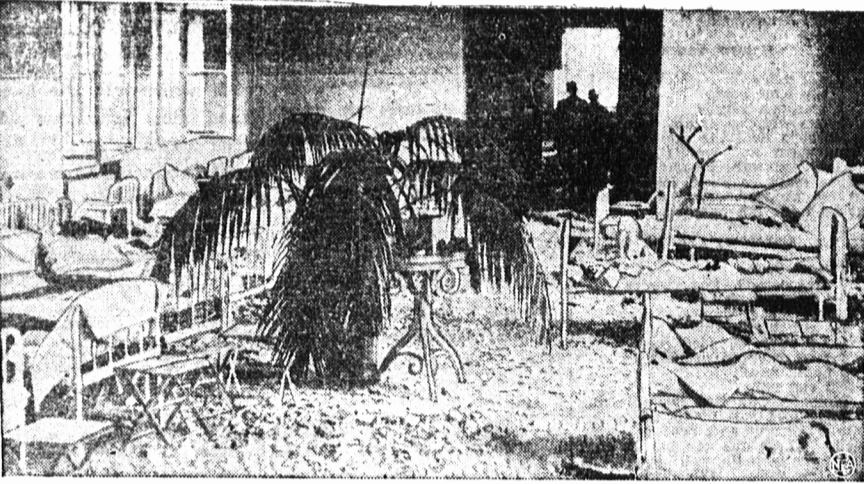

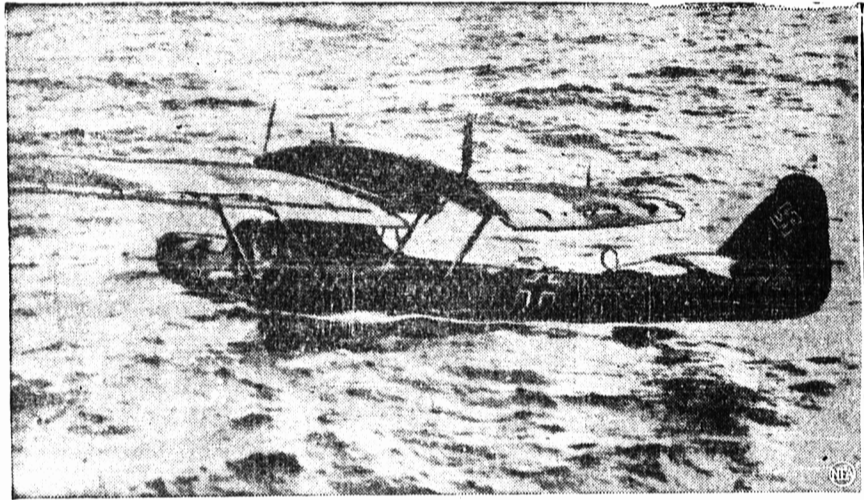
Turkey's refusal of Soviet military demands and decision to conclude mutual assistance pacts with allies increases tension in lower Balkans. Scenes like this, showing Turkish army tanks and planes in maneuvers near Angora, may soon be widespread following reports that Turkey is mobilizing and Russian troops are being massed along Iran and Turkish borders.



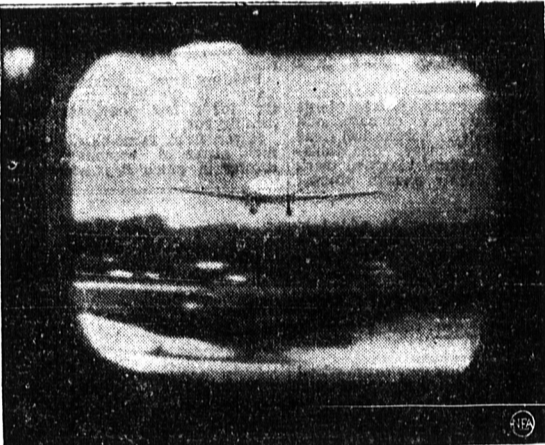
As a result of one of the incongruities that war brings about so frequently, this French soldier, on sentry duty in a section of captured German territory, finds himself "guarding" a memorial to German soldiers killed in the Great War.



Twenty-five hundred pounds of bombs did this to a Catholic hospital ward in Praga, Warsaw suburb, in one of the last raids before the capital surrendered. Twisted, broken beds frame a still-standing potted palm. This picture was taken by Julien Bryan, famous freelance photographer, who was the last cameraman to leave Warsaw.



Riding the waves while its Nazi crew awaits rescue, one of the four German bombing planes reported shot down by British guns during a raid on Scotland's Firth of Forth, is pictured in this first radiophoto of the air and sea action in northern Scotland.



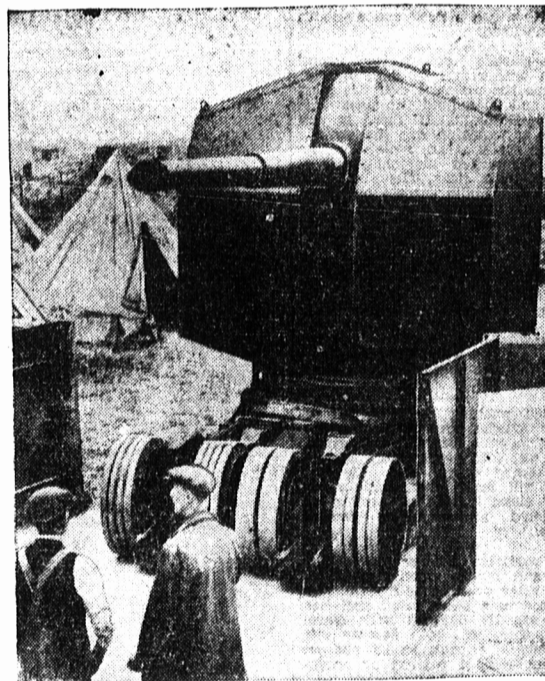

The image was flashed from the ground by R.C.A. engineers conducting the first demonstration of television inside an airplane. 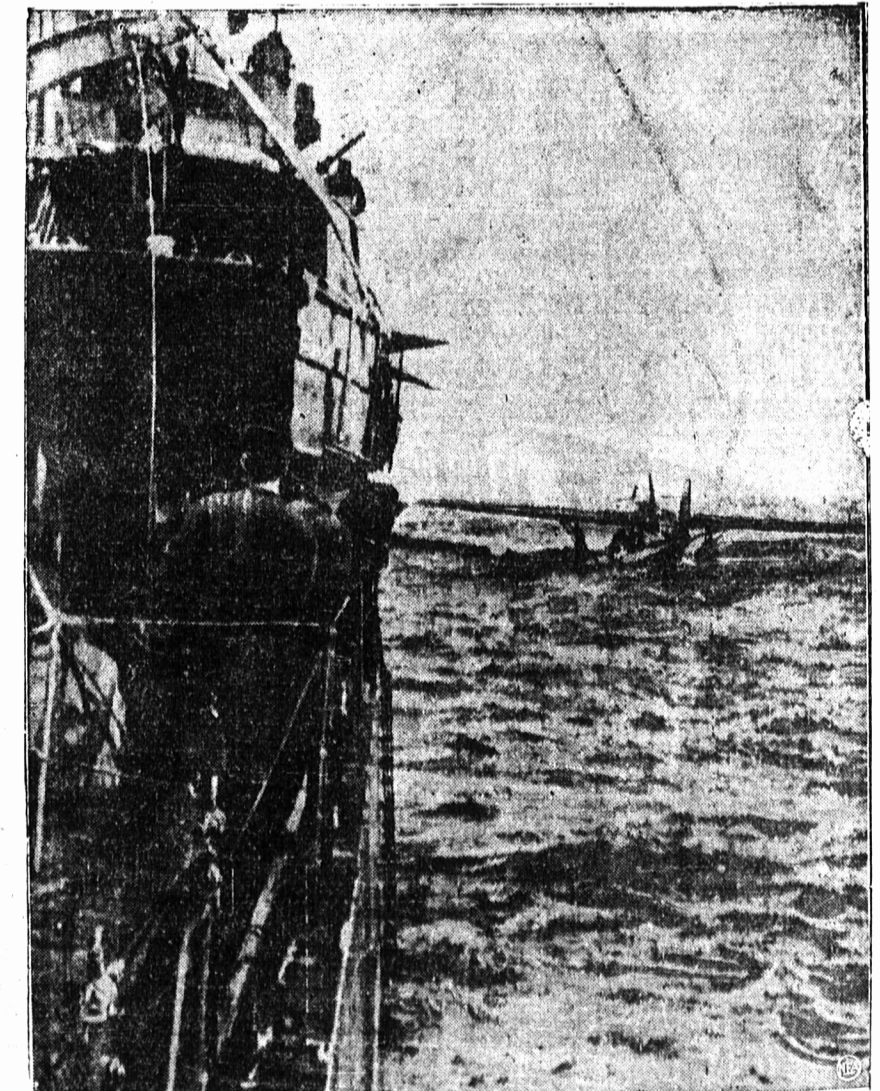
