BERLIN CELEBRATES NAPOLEON'S FALL

Kaiser Starts Celebration of Rising Against France.

BERLIN, March 17 (Special)—Emperor William and the Prussian people started the celebration of the centenary of the rising against the Emperor Napoleon which culminated in the battle of Leipzig in October, 1813, when the combined Prussian, Russian, Austrian and Swedish armies defeated Napoleon's troops with great loss and opened the way for the liberation of Germany from Napoleonic control and for the downfall of Napoleon.

This was the centenary of the establishment of the Iron Cross, a decoration given to German soldiers for the display of great courage on the field of battle.

In spite of a drizzling rain enormous crowds gathered to cheer the Emperor on his way to place wreaths on a number of Berlin statues, including those of King William and Queen Luise.

The Emperor later in the day attended a service of thanks in the Cathedral and also reviewed a parade of the troops of the Berlin garrison, many of the regiments of which carried the battle flags which they had borne in the Napoleonic wars a century ago.



MORSE ON HIS WAY HOME.

BOSTON, March 12—Charles W. Morse, with his financial citizenship boasting the cover of two flags, while he has no citizenship himself, is speeding over the sea to America today on a fast ocean liner to resume his gigantic operations just one year and two months after the doctors at the Federal prison at Atlantic, Ga., solemnly felt his pulse and said he would die in one year. It was January 19, 1911, that the Board of Physicians, headed by Dr. A. L. Fowler, consulted that medical horoscope Morse then possessed and decided that the stars had doomed him within a twelve-month period.

His return is of special interest to residents of New England where he organized the Eastern Steamship Company and built the Harvard and Yale, two fast turbine steamers which piled between Boston and New York up to a short time ago.

It is said that he now plans to build a line of boats that will operate from New York to the North, taking in Boston and Maine ports, including Bath, his birthplace, and placing them in communication with Canada.

While the doctors are feeling his pulse today to see just how much of a laugh the financier can enjoy at the expense of forecast and medical prediction, aged one year, Morse is feeling of the ticker with the free hand and preparing to give a demonstration of the art of coming back.

EXPENSE ACCOUNT BOOKS GIVEN TO WORKING GIRLS.

PHILADELPHIA, March 12—In an effort to secure accurate data regarding the necessary expenditures of working girls and women the consumers' league of this city is having thousands of condensed account books printed and will today begin to distribute them among workers in mercantile and industrial plants. Members of the league, which has already compiled much data regarding the wages paid here, states that it is futile to expect a girl offhand to give the details of her expenditures. The books, which they hope will be kept regularly and returned within a specified time, are expected to give much information not at present available.

Should the bill for a minimum wage commission now before the state legislature become a law the information secured by the league will be placed in the hands of the commission.

DEMobilIZATION OF ARMIES

Russia and Austria Both Desirous of Peace.

ST. PETERSBURG, March 17 (Special)—Demobilization by Russia and Austria-Hungary is announced in an official communication issued by the two countries. This sets forth that the exchange of letters between Emperor Francis Joseph and the Tsar have proved the continued friendship of the two nations and that both are desirous of maintaining peace.

"The two governments therefore," continues the communication, "have arrived at the agreement that certain measures of a purely defensive character in the frontier provinces are no longer required, and accordingly have decided to reduce the Austria-Hungarian forces in Galicia to a normal footing, while Russia will disband the reservists that should have been disbanded in autumn."

A semi-official Russian agency is authorized to state that as a result of the explanations exchanged with the Vienna Cabinet, Austria cherishes no aggressive policy against her neighbors in the south.
