**BRITISH BOMBED  
GERMANS IN TRENCHES.**

LONDON, Dec. 13.—The following British official communication from the army in France, was issued to-night:

"On Wednesday sixteen of our aeroplanes bombed a stores depot at Miramont (Somme district) and the aerodrome at Hervilly. The attack was carried out in a high westerly wind, which made flying difficult. All the machines returned safely, and considerable damage is believed to have been done to both objectives.

"Our artillery has continued the bombardment of portions of the enemy's lines at West-Marquart, and La Boutellierie. The parapet has been breached in several places. A fire started by our artillery yesterday in Cite Saint Elle, was still burning this afternoon. The enemy's shelling of Armentieres, in reply to our bombardment, caused two fires which were quickly got under control.

"A successful bombing party was carried out by us last night about Neuve Chapelle. The German trenches were entered, although strongly held; one German machine gun was destroyed by bombs, and a number of casualties were inflicted on the enemy, and the party returned to our trenches safely. One officer and four soldiers were wounded.

"The weather since the last communication, has been stormy and wet."

**BUYING NEW FEED**

Begin Now to Look up Good Seed That is for Sale

Good seeds play an important part in the success of the farm and this time is not too early for thinking about the seeds for next year. December is a good month to buy so as to have first choice of the offerings of the market. Good storage must be provided for this new seed, which should be only of the best, and this is the time for preparing the storehouse and enquiring into the breeding of such grain and other seed that is offered for sale. The winter fairs bring together samples of the best seed in the country, and a visit to one of other of these exhibitions will repay anyone who is on the lookout for improved yields in the future.

Seed grown in one's own district or on land like to that of the home farm is perhaps the safest to use, provided it comes from good stock; but an experiment with good new varieties is to be recommended to every farmer who wishes to increase his production, though such experiment should be made on a small scale, as all soils are not suited to the same varieties, and climate has a certain amount of influence upon the crop. The man experienced in the selection of seed seldom needs to make purchases of new stock, but any one is apt to meet with misfortune in a certain season and be left in such a position that renewal of seed from an outside source is necessary. As it is, too many farmers are struggling with varieties of grain in particular that are unsuited to their soil or climate such men should take advantage of the practice and results obtained by their nearest experiment station. A change may be needed in one's system of cultivation, but the matter of the seed used is very likely to be the cause of persistent failure of crops.

**FATTENING CHICKENS**

A fat chicken is not only worth a few cents more per pound than a thin bird, but the final pound, put on by the right method, repays the owner from fifty to seventy-five per cent profit. Several methods for fattening chickens on the farm have been tried out at several of the agricultural colleges and at many of our large commercial poultry plants. Fattening in crates and in runs are the two plans recommended by these authorities.

In the former method crates measuring about two feet square and about eighteen inches high are built, four in a row, and set up in tiers with dropping-boards between. Four birds are put in a crate, there being only enough space for them to turn around. A trough runs along the front of the pens, in which the feed is placed three times a day.

The chickens are confined in these quarters three weeks before being slaughtered. During the first week the birds are a little underfed, the second they get all they want, and the last week they are given all they will possibly eat. They are fed solely in the form of a wet mash made of cheap grain chop, mixed into a paste by adding skim milk or buttermilk.

The other method is to confine the fowl in small runs, where they have more freedom than in the crates. The same feeds are used in both cases. Fattening by this plan usually takes longer.

The main advantage of crate fattening is that your birds take less feed and time to put on flesh and the meat produced is tenderer. With the birds in runs, however, you lose fewer fowls through sickness, and not so much care or experience is needed in feeding.
