THE GUARDIAN'S WEEK END SERMON.

The Rev. Dr. George Thomas Dowling delivered his farewell sermon recently as rector of St. James Episcopal Church, Brooklyn, New York. The topic was "What I Have Tried to Teach You." The text was II Thessalonians ii:5: "When I was yet with you I told you these things." Dr. Dowling said:

As a man grows older he believes less than when he was in the period of his credulous youth, but he believes that "less" more. There are few things which strike him in his religious consciousness, but when they do they strike deeper. And this is so because he has learned to sift the essential from the non-essential; the practical from the theoretical.

You will not misunderstand me, I am sure. The youth is perfectly honest, when at twenty he says, "I believe." He thinks he does; but he does not. He only believes that he is attainable without any effort. He believes. Much of his faith is adherent not inherent. He has learned it from his Sunday school teacher, or his minister, or in the theological seminary. It is a wax flower, tied or not until the plant has been watered by his tears of penitence and pain; not until it has been painted by his sunlight; not until it has drooped in the darkness and smiled at the morning does his belief become a growth; the real blossoming of his inner experience. Jesus said to His disciples: "I have yet many things to say unto you, but ye cannot bear them now; and life is full of these withheld revelations."

My brethren, in the realm of religion you and I only believe—I was going to say, that which we would do for. Possibly that might be an exaggeration. But this is not: You and I only believe that which we are living for. The moment you define you confine. No one can frame God. Nevertheless, they are the best we have.

But I am not concerned to-day so much with the "truth made portable" as with the truth made practical. A man may assent to every article of the Apostles' Creed and yet be a bad man; and there have been such men. That was what St. Paul meant when he spoke of the possibility of "holding the truth in an righteousness." That was what St. James meant when he said "the devil also believe and tremble."

And because of their effect upon character these are the things which have tried to teach you. They are fundamental. They are basic things God's guidance, God's goodness, God's grace, Providence! Benevolent! Help! This is I have come to understand it during the year was Jesus' message to the world and this I have conscientiously and persistently tried to make my message to you. My dear people, never let go of these. And then, however deep the mysteries of life, however dark the night, there will always be light enough to get home. God's guidance: an All-wise Providence which, whether we know it or not, is ever leading us on, just as He led the Children of Israel, not only in the right way, but as they themselves saw, when at last they had reached the end, in the right way.

Oh, my people, this is what I mean when I urge you to believe in God, as presented by His Son Jesus Christ. "Come unto me," says Unbelief, "and ye shall find restlessness!" "Come unto me," says Faith as this "and ye shall find rest." Remember that nothing in your life is completed till God has had his turn. Do not try to reach conclusions until the conclusion.

This, then, is the first thing which I have tried to teach you: God's guidance. And the second is God's goodness. For the purpose for which we are created, discipline and development of character, this is a good world. There comes time when it seems otherwise; but that when it seems so fail to persistently believe that it is a good world, and that we are being guided by a good God. Fight such a tendency, as you would a miasma.

And then again, this view of God and of the world in which He has placed us means not only success or happiness. Why, there is not one of us who cannot find troubles enough if we look for them; enough to sin in. And there is not one of us who cannot find blessings enough if we look for them; enough to buoy us up and to carry us toward the heaven.

The Bible tells us of a man who was typical. Human, and apparently he had everything that he might desire, except one thing. He was Prime Minister of a Kingdom, and the most wretched man in it. He had position, honor, riches, a home, everything. But he called his family together one day, and after telling them all his wealth and all his power, and glory, and success, he added: "Yet all this availeth me nothing, so long as I see Mordecai the Jew sitting at the King's gate!" And why? Because Mordecai would not bow to him when, with his re-

tinued and all his pomp, he passed in and out of that gate. Why, the man had more bows than he knew what to do with. Everybody was bowing to him. Wherever he went they were all bowing and bowing and bowing. But all that availed him nothing, because, poor fellow, he was one bow short.

Why should you carry your troubles to bed with you and thus make a sleepless night? God is not dead. Learn to fold up your troubles with our prayers. Do not out in the foreground what Jesus has relegated to the rear, for He is our Master. He knew more of life than any of us. And He teaches us, first of all, to believe that God is guiding and God is good. And the last article of this working creed which I have tried to give you from Sunday to Sunday is God's grace. That means help. Oh, never forget that more tenderly than a mother listens for the cry of her child "He heareth the cry of the afflicted." What a wonderful passage that is: "The spirit also helps our infirmities." We can always find those who will help us here we are strong, but He helps us where we are weak. Let your life be a life of prayer. May God be with you! May you be with God.

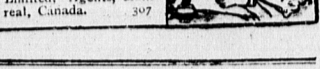

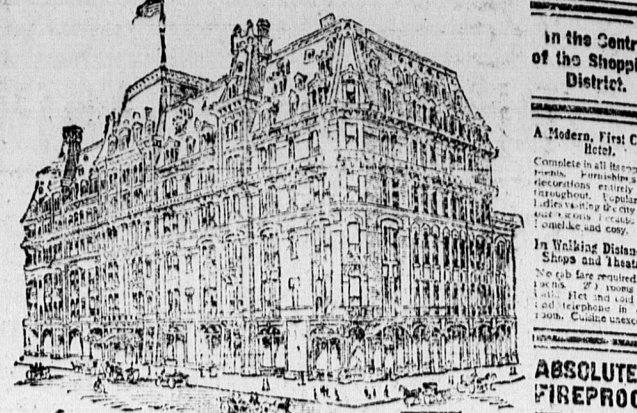
