

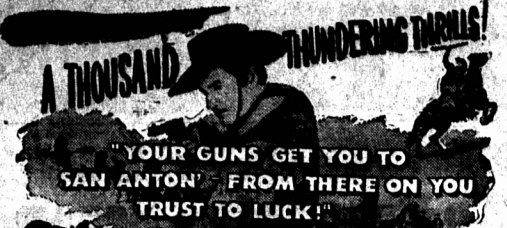

HORSE IN SUMMER NEEDS MORE SALT

The horse is a work animal and needs the various ingredients, including mineral nutrients, that are necessary for highest efficiency. In addition to the general quantity of salt which every horse requires to keep him in fit condition throughout the year, he needs more salt in summer. A horse freely perspires and this condition makes additional demand upon the supply of salt within the body of the horse. A horse perspires over the entire body surface much as a man perspires over the entire body. Athletes have been known to lose from 6 to 8 lbs. or more during a single strenuous workout, a single race or a game, and a horse with its larger body surface may be expected to excrete correspondingly larger amounts of sweat. Every pound of sweat carries about two grams of salt out of the body. Hence the danger that a horse doing heavy work in summer heat may suffer from salt deficiency.
