The following letter received from Everett McLeod, by his sister Miss Annie McLeod, Grand View.

My Dear Sister:-

Just a few lines in answer to your most welcome letter.

Since I wrote you before we had a turn in the trenches which is not very pleasant this time of the year. We got along O. K. and consider ourselves lucky only had a few casualties although we were shelled pretty heavy at times. It is not very pleasant to be in a trench and shells dropping all around you expecting every minute that one will land in your trench but "Fritz" has nothing on our artillery he soon quiet down when our starts. We were out on a working party the other night for, as you know, all work around the trenches has to be done at night. We all had a load of stuff for repairing the trenches, when "Fritz" turned his machine gun on us "talk about getting down and hugging the ground," you don't look around for a clean place to lay when a machine gun is turned on you sometimes the beggars keep you in the mud ten minutes.

There is some excitement here when a German aeroplane comes across our line as there is sure to be a scrap. We saw them bring a German down

I acknowledge receipt of your communication of the 27th instant, with enclosed money order for \$5.00 covering payment of the fee for analysis of a sample of "Mixed Paint" alleged to have been purchased from The T. Eaton Company Ltd., by Mr. Morris Phillips.

In reply, I beg to advise that according to the report of the Chief Analyst, the sample submitted is found to contain:-

Pigment 57.44 p. c. Vehicle 42.56 p. c.

The Pigment above referred to has the following composition:

Basic Carbonate of Lead	0.80 p. c.	Lead Sulphate	0.74 p. c.
Zinc Oxide	8.21 "	Barium Sulphate	17.17 "
Zinc Sulphide	11.71 "	Silica & Silicates by (difference)	18.81 "

The article is of exceedingly low value as a paint. The pigment essentially consists of Barium Sulphate and Silicate which have very little covering power. The amount of lead contained in it is very small indeed. The statement in the advertisement that "it contains all that a first class paint should contain" is certainly incorrect and misleading.
