Dempsey Retains Title Of Heavyweight Champion

PATHETIC SCENE PRESENTED AS FIRPO TAKES THE COUNT IN THE SECOND—CLOSE TO A HUNDRED THOUSAND FIGHT FANS HELD SPELLBOUND AS FATAL TEN IS TOLLED, THEN GOES WILD WITH ENTHUSIASM AS THE "TIGER'S" GLOVED HAND IS HELD ALOFT BY REFEREE JOHN GALLAGHER, IN TOKEN OF VICTORY—MOUNTED POLICE WERE CALLED INTO ACTION TO HANDLE THE CROWD, BEFORE AND DURING FIGHT—THE CHALLENGER, LUIS ANGEL FIRPO KNOCKED OUT WITH A RIGHT HOOK AND A LEFT TO THE CHIN IN THE SECOND.

POLO GROUNDS, Sept. 14.—Dempsey, world's heavyweight champion, knocked out Luis Angel Firpo, the Argentine challenger, in the second round of a scheduled 15-round contest tonight.

The bout ended 55 seconds after the start of the furious second round, when Dempsey floored the challenger with punches to the face and when he struggled to the ground he was knocked out with a left and a right to the chin.

Margaret Dillon Wins Free-For-All

WOODSTOCK, N. B., Sept. 14.—The races yesterday attracted a crowd that ever assembled at Islet Park, and some huge crowds have been there in the past. It was a string of automobiles, and not a single mishap occurred.

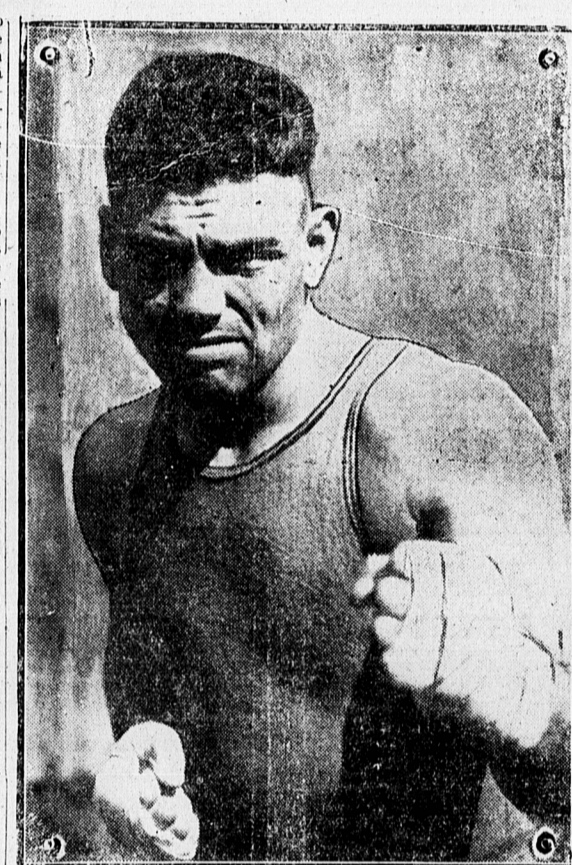

Firpo, who entered the arena while the last preliminary was in progress, was the first to enter the ring. He was followed a moment later by Dempsey. The challenger scowled heavily at his opponent, but the champion apparently paid no attention to the South American.

Dempsey's Statement.

The champion discussed his plan of battle with Jimmie Dougherty, of Philadelphia, who refereed the Gibbons-Dempsey fight at Shelby. "I think I'll crowd him," Jack said.

Paris Featured the Big Battle.

PARIS, Sept. 14.—The Dempsey-Firpo fight held a place on the first page of all the Parisian newspapers this morning, which have printed columns of details of the battle and also photographs of both the fighters. The fight created the greatest interest ever evinced in a pugilistic encounter in the history of boxing, with the exception of the Carpentier-Dempsey battle in Jersey City.
