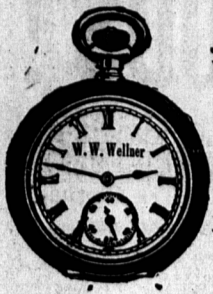

At the Police Court yesterday George Essery was convicted of first violation of the Prohibition Act and fined \$100 and costs. The case against Jos. Pembroke was adjourned for a week.

MANY friends in Charlottetown will hear with great regret of the death of Mrs. McDonald, wife of Contractor James W. McDonald, St. John's, N. B., who died in Charlottetown. The sad event took place Monday afternoon last and the funeral took place Wednesday.

RUMOR has it that the promoters of the dry dock and shipbuilding project are considering the advisability of locating at Louisburg if the people of that town are willing to extend substantial assistance. Louisburg's superiority as an ice-free port is recognized as an important factor in this connection.—Sydney Record.

It is reported that the Nova Scotia Steel & Coal Company has made a request to the government to have the ice-breaker Montcalm sent as soon as possible to Sydney to break up the harbor ice and give ocean-going shipping free access to the piers. The Montcalm, according to a recent port, is shortly to be sent in this direction to do signal work at the entrance of the gulf.

The Nova Scotia government have adopted measures designed to assist farmers in securing seed grain on easy terms. Owing to the shortage in the hay crop particularly in eastern Nova Scotia many farmers have incurred heavy expenses in purchasing fodder for live stock, using therefore money which might have been available to buy seed grain. The situation in many districts is acute and in order to make it possible for farmers to procure the needed grain for spring sowing, money has to be borrowed.

The Guardian has received a copy of the Royal Gazette, Hamilton, Bermuda, containing an extended report of the excellent lecture recently delivered there by John H. Bell, Summerside, on a crowded house. It says in introduction:—On Tuesday evening last Mr. J. H. Bell, ex-M. P. of P. E. Island, Canada, delivered a lecture on "The Old World and the New" to a crowded audience in Thorburn Hall, Warwick. For an hour and a half with the ease and skill of a master in the art of public speaking he commanded the unwearying attention and frequent applause of his hearers. Under the guidance of one of the pleasantest of companions and the most intelligent of observers the audience were conducted over the old country.

Miss Webster really completed the three years course in about two and a half years and graduated at the head of her class, leading her nearest competitor by seven marks. Following were the marks made by Miss Webster: General Nursing 94; Gynecology 90; Surgery (clinical) 77; Urine Analysis 95; Practice 95. Following this highly successful examination Miss Webster has been appointed Night Superintendent of St. Luke's Hospital and has entered upon her duties in that position. The graduating exercises take place on Saturday next. Her many friends will be pleased to learn of this brilliant success.

The following resolution adopted unanimously at the last regular meeting of Grand Division North Westshire speaks for itself. Whereas a rumor has got abroad that certain members of the Legislature are secretly opposing the amendments to the Prohibition Act proposed by the Grand Division and adopted by the Temperance Alliance; Therefore Resolved that Triumph Division strongly condemn such conduct, and further resolved that this Division will do its utmost to find out the facts, and if it is discovered that when these amendments come before either the party caucus or the Legislature, any member representing a district where our Order is strong, opposes said amendments, this Division will use its greatest influence with sister divisions and with the Grand Division to prevent such member ever being returned to the Legislature again. The membership of this Division is 98 of whom a very large number were present on the night this resolution was passed, and it has the support of all the prominent people of the district.

HALIFAX IN FAVOR OF THE TUNNEL.

HALIFAX, April 12.—The Board of Trade adopted the following resolution: "Whereas the Province of Prince Edward Island suffers loss and hardships every year, owing to its isolation during the winter season and in consequence of which handicap, the progress and prosperity of the Island are arrested and the benefits to be derived from confederation with the Dominion are largely neutralized, and whereas no province in Canada, irrespective of its size and population should be permanently handicapped by obstacles to its development, if these obstacles can be removed by reasonable expenditure of public money, and believing further that everything that tends to bring the province of the Dominion more closely into touch with each other must help to consolidate and build up the country, this board is of the opinion that the Dominion Government should guarantee the necessary financial aid towards the early construction of a railway tunnel between Prince Edward Island and the mainland. The resolution was discussed at length and was adopted by a large vote.

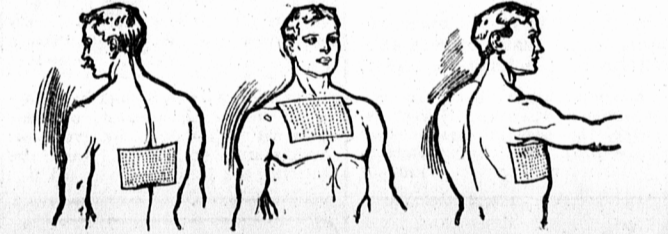
