YOUR PUDDINGS WILL COST YOU MORE. - The many housewives who intend turning out a big batch of Christmas cakes and puddings during the next fortnight will find that some hitherto indispensable adjuncts of the festive board are either unobtainable or only to be had at a very much higher price. There will be no fresh Valencia or Sultan raisins here this year for cooking purposes. The only raisins available are the California muscats. Turkey also supplies some good things besides cigarettes, and Turkish figs are no more. The local grocers are already featuring various seasonable specialties for Christmas, such as oranges, grape fruit, dates, prunes, almonds, nuts of various kinds, crystallized fruits, and although the prices in many cases are advanced the supply of most of the staple ingredients of Christmas fare is as ample as ever.

PORK MARKET. - The pork market yesterday remained unchanged, 10 1/2 cents being paid for selected weights, with vital organs included. Parties still complain of the great number of this hog being offered, stating that it cannot be insisted upon too strongly in the interests of all concerned that these should be held and not until properly finished. Advices from Toronto report a reduction in the price of hogs of 1/2 cent per pound coming into effect at once.
