### GERMAN SHIPYARDS SHUT UP BY STRIKE

HAMBURG, Aug. 29.—The general lockout consequent upon the strike of shipyard workers has now extended to every yard, and German shipbuilding is absolutely at a standstill. There are as yet no prospects of agreement, as the employers are not inclined to negotiate. At the last conference of employers the Hamburg and the other North Sea shipyards were willing to come to an arrangement, but this was prevented by the uncompromising attitude of the Baltic shipyards—a proceeding unmistakably due to the influence of the naval authorities. In particular the large shipyards, which are chiefly occupied in building warships, rejected the compromise, with the support of the Ministry of Marine. In this way it is explained why the Department of the Interior sees "no occasion to intervene."

The large shipyards are determined to fight the matter to an end, and the struggle is expected to last eight weeks, and may even extend to three months, according to the means at the strikers' disposal. Already several ships needing repairs have left Hamburg for English and Belgian yards, and it is just in repairs that the most profit lies, for competition in building new ships is so keen that profit is cut down to the narrowest margin. The number of strikers has been reduced by some thousands, who have left and found employment elsewhere. The total number of men out of work is now about 33,500. The resolution of sympathy by English trade unionists with German strikers has been communicated, and their promise of financial aid has been received with lively satisfaction.

### OFFERED \$75,000 FOR HARVESTER.

BOSTON, August 29.—Wm. G. Bradley, the wealthy New York horseman, owner of the stallion Binger, sire of Uhlán, 1.58 $\frac{1}{2}$ , today through an agent made an offer of \$75,000 for the champion trotting stallion The Harvester, 2.02. The proposition was made at the Readville track, where the grand circuit meeting begins tomorrow, and where the stallion is in charge of trainer Ed. Geers, for his start against his record Thursday. August Uhlsen, of Milwaukee, owner of The Harvester, would not entertain the offer. Nothing daunted the champion's agent, who went after the champion's three year old stallion Colorado E. 2.07 $\frac{1}{2}$ , first offering Geo. Estabrooks, of Denver, Colorado, \$40,000 for the horse, and later advancing to an even \$50,000. The deal was left in abeyance, the parties to meet after the American horse breeder's futurity on Thursday.

### NO NEWSPAPER INTERVIEWS.

MONTREAL, Aug. 30.—It is announced that Cardinal Yvanvitch, the representative of the Pope at the Eucharistic Congress, would eschew all newspaper interviews during his visit to Canada. At the request of his eminence no newspaper men will be allowed on board the Lady Grey which will bring the party up to Montreal.

In a strong address Bishop Archambault declared that so far as the Roman Catholic Church is concerned no good Catholic could become a member of the Masonic Order, whether of French, English or Scottish rite.

### DOUBLE TRAGEDY IN TORONTO HOME.

TORONTO, Aug. 29.—A double tragedy was enacted at ten Robert St. set this morning, when Augustus Merkt shot and killed his wife and then blew out his own brains.

When their daughter Lottie and a boarder named Henry King Clark, entered the house at noon for luncheon, they found the body of the woman lying on the kitchen floor, her head toward the door with a gaping bullet wound in her left temple. The man was found in the sitting room in the front part of the house with a great wound in the side of his head, and the floor crimson with coagulated blood.

The daughter was prostrated by the sight, and Clark immediately sent an alarm to police headquarters.

Merkt, it was ascertained, had been in an insane asylum and only regained his liberty today. Both he and his wife were elderly and had been married thirty-seven years. He was employed as a cook, and from letters on the body it was found that he had served with a number of local hotels.

### GASOLINE FOR FIRE ENGINES.

MONTREAL, Aug. 29.—Gasoline automobile fire engines with a speed of sixty miles an hour, capable of using the same power for driving their pumps as their wheels, are the latest additions planned for the Montreal fire brigade. Chief Tremblay has returned from the annual convention Fire Chiefs at Syracuse and saw these of the International Association of machines in operation. A report favoring the purchase of at least two of these machines will be made to the board of control and it is the intention, if the report is favorably considered, to use them in the outlying districts of the city. The real difficulty with engines of this description in these latitudes would appear to be with the snow, but the chief states that they will go where horses can go and over many roads where it could not.

### INTERNATIONAL STRIKE OF SEAMEN.

COPENHAGEN, August 28.—Delegates from all the Seamen's Unions of Europe and America represented at the International Congress of Sailors and Marine Firemen in session here agreed this morning to declare an international strike, unless ship owners of every country concerned agree to the formation of a Board of Conciliation to deal with the grievances of the men.

The proposal for the strike was the subject of heated discussion at the Congress, the delegates of several of the continental countries having opposed the suggestions of British Unions for the strike. The date of the threatened strike will be known only to the leaders of the International Congress who are pledged to secrecy. It is confidentially expected that the full convention will approve the strike resolution when it is laid before the Conference for final action.

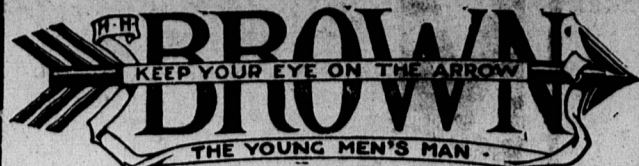
