**Forceful Address Given By Maj. J. A. MacDonald**

Following are excerpts from an address delivered Friday night by Major J. A. MacDonald, Progressive Conservative candidate for "Third Kings".

"This Island of ours is — quite justifiably — extremely proud of its war record. Foremost is Red Cross work, in Victory Loan Drives and in the percentage of enlistments per capita we have shown the other provinces a fine example of co-operation and effort on the part of all our people.

In the present federal election campaign one feature in the program of the Liberal party candidates whether on the air, on the public platform, or through the medium of the press, stands out like a sore thumb. It is the complete avoidance or relegating to the background of any reference to the manpower issue. Why are they so completely on the defensive with regard to this question? Propaganda from government and other sources is being poured out on every vote-catching angle yet the most vital issue of all, because it involves the precious heritage of Canadian youth, is given scant attention. When a subject so overshadowing as this one has been deliberately sidetracked the obvious reason is a guilty conscience. They might well be ashamed of their handling of this — the most important problem of our war effort — as a result of their timorous and unfair policy we had a wave of unparalleled disunity throughout the country; a serious lowering of army discipline in Canada; puzzled resentment by our Allies; angry disillusionment from the boys overseas; and even letters from our enemies across the front lines.

**Made Wrong Start**

"Let us review briefly the events involved in the critical situation which developed in 1942. Instead of introducing a firm and just policy of recruitment when our country was morally committed to war by the declaration of September 1939 the Liberal government introduced a form of voluntary enlistment. We started off on the wrong foot and the premium became too high when Mr. King said you could fight either overseas or at home. The army casualties began coming in from the Mediterranean area. Not long after D-day the situation became critical. Into the reinforcement stream poured many under age and over age, others insufficiently trained and some medically unfit as the government's "barrel-scraping" methods tried to maintain the re-inforcements. If many honest Liberals could appreciate the additional hardships and danger thrust on our troops they would be as bitterly anti-King as our boys overseas are. While these events were taking place in Europe

**Nelson Named Favorite For Golf Tourney**

NEW YORK, May 26 — (AP) — Byron Nelson is the 8-to-5 favorite in tomorrow's medal-play half of the pro Golfers' Association Fund match but it is slamin' Sam Snead, his opponent, who has the confidence.

Nelson, who won eight winter tournaments while averaging 68.2 for 8 rounds of play, never has done well on the pinched fairways of the Fresh Meadows course where tomorrow's 36-hole duel will be played. Snead won the Goodall Round Robin tournament there in 1942.

Sunday the two will transfer their match to the Essex County, N. J. country club for 36 holes or less of match play. Besides from the two events will be used to provide golf equipment and facilities at veterans' hospitals.

Although Fresh Meadows has but two par five holes in its 6,800-yard layout, Nelson says he believes Snead should be favored because of the West Virginian's drives. Nelson also feels he is over-golfed and not at the top of his game.

Snead, who averaged 69.4 for 40 rounds while winning six titles this winter, has played both courses this week and equalled Fresh Meadows' par of 90 while dropping five strokes off the regulation figures with a 66 at Essex County.

Nelson also toured various New England courses and returned with a 69-70-72-72-69 score card.

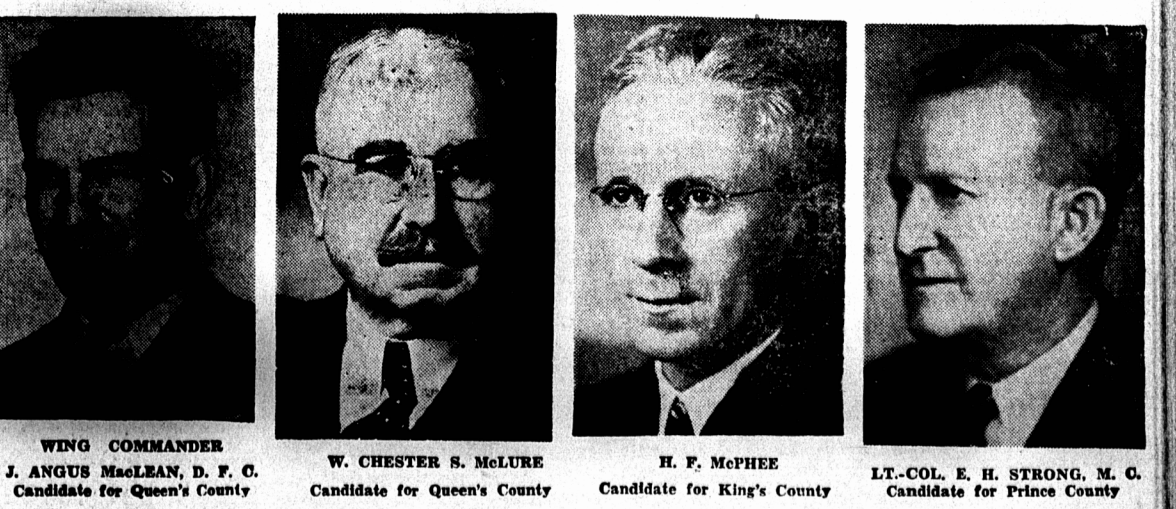
