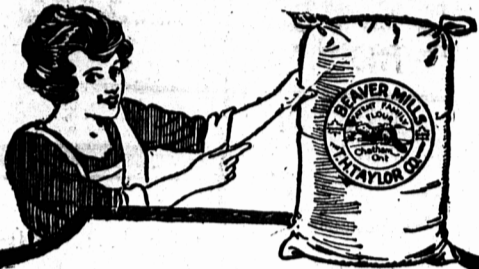

Mason, Chief Preventive Officer of Inland Revenue, who has just returned from an expedition through Gloucester County, N. B., in search of illicit stills. Ten stills in all were found at Carquet, St. Isidore, Shippegan, Inkerman, Pokemouche and Petite Lamey in Gloucester County.

Russo-Polish Peace Conference

RIGA, Sept. 25—Following the presentation of the Soviet peace proposals at yesterday's session of the Russo-Polish peace conference, M. Dumski, Polish under-Secretary for Foreign Affairs, presented the preliminary Polish terms which had been prepared before M. Joffe. They were in no sense a reply to the new Soviet proposals. M. Dumski's suggestions were based on peace preliminaries and included first mutual recognition of the sovereignty of Poland by Soviet-Russia and no interference in domestic affairs.

Second, determination of boundaries is not in a spirit of historical revenge but on a basis of just consolation of vital interests.

Third, that contracting parties grant free choice of Russian-Polish citizenship to all persons affected by the treaty.

Fourth, that both powers agree to the free cultural linguistic and religious developments and fifth, the renunciation of restitution in any form by Poland or expenses of Polish-Soviet war.

How Canada Lost Rowing Race

BRUSSELS, Sept. 23—Canadian rowing enthusiasts and followers of the Argonaut Olympic four have already learned of the misfortune which forced the four which represented Canada at the Olympic regatta at Brussels to row their qualifying heat against conditions rather than against racing opponents. They were beaten by Switzerland and Sweden.

The Canadian shell which went from Canada along with the crew, arrived at the course only in time to allow the oarsmen three work-days.

Joe Wright and Tommy Allison had taken full advantage of the shore time at their disposal before the day set for the preliminary heats, and the crew showed that it could overcome the handicap of being out of the shell for fifteen

days. English and continental rowing centres who say the four perform in the workouts freely conceded Canada a good chance of coming through with the honors in the finals. Before going into the water on race day the coach of the Swiss crew, drawn for the first heat along with Sweden and Canada, admitted that the crew which wore the Maple Leaf was the crew to beat. The Hay brothers-Landriau-Harcourt combination went onto the water to the starter in splendid condition and calmly confident.

At the drop of the flag Canada and Switzerland broke away from the Swedish four. The play in the delicate gunwale resulted in No. 2 having great difficulty to get his oar out of the water. In spite of this handicap the Canadian crew held its form and was leading the 500-metre mark, with Switzerland second and Sweden two lengths behind. The rigger opposite Harcourt's seat gradually became weaker, to the extent that the finish No. 2 oar was practically use-

less. The Canadians finished third. Even in defeat the Olympic four made many friends.

Before the race was finished P. J. Mulqueen, the representative of the C.A. A. O. of the Olympic regatta, protested to the starter. Several spectators near the starting point affirmed that the Canadian crew had informed the starter of the difficulty before the start. To have entertained the protest would have meant to order the race rowed over again which would have been unfair to Switzerland and Sweden.

to have altered the whole program of the regatta events, which was out of the question.

No blame for the mishap can be attached to anyone. The Canadians went to the Olympic games without a boatman, but the British coaches generously loaned the services of the boatmen who were carrying for the Leander eight-oared shell, and these men gave considerable attention to the Canadian four-against Belgium and Czechoslovakia in 7.19.

new shell must have cracked in the last hard sprint the Canadian four were given on the day before their race. Even that can only be a conjecture.

It must not be overlooked that in spite of the handicap, the Canadian four finished the heat in 7.18 one second behind the time of the United States four which won the third heat against France and Brazil. Norway won the second heat against Belgium and Czechoslovakia in 7.19.

The Swiss four won the final with a world's record of 6.54.

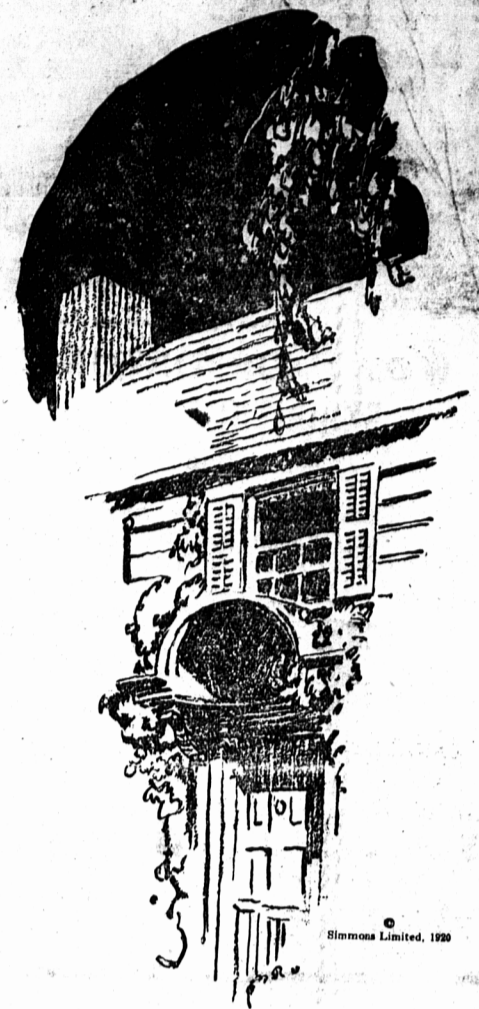

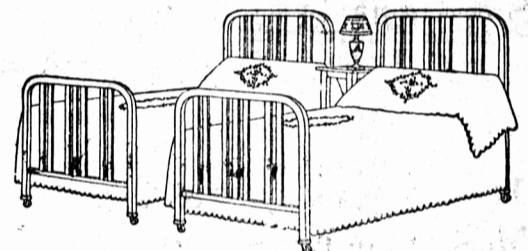
