TO TEST CITIZENS RE PROHIBITION

Meeting Held Last Evening With This Purpose in View.

A meeting was held in the city Magistrate's room last evening for the purpose of planning a canvass of the city to ascertain the sentiment of the people re the present prohibition law.

Rev. Maurice McDonald took the chair and Rev. O. H. Peters was appointed Secretary.

It was quite a largely attended meeting, all denominations being well represented. Terms were appointed to canvass all wards of the city and the following thirty teams of two each, Protestant and Catholic were appointed, proving the unanimity of spirit in this movement. The canvass is to be undertaken at the earliest possible date, and citizens are asked to facilitate the work of the canvassers by being ready to sign promptly when solicited.

Two petitions will be circulated, the white for the male electors of the city and the blue for all citizens, male and female, other than electors, over eighteen years of age. The meeting adjourned to meet at 8 o'clock on next Monday evening.
