FAVORITE HYMNS AND THEIR WRITERS

No. 2 "SHEPHERD OF TENDER YOUTH."

Outside the pages of the New Testament, there is probably the earliest Christmas hymn. It was written by Clement of Alexandria, who was one of the great figures of the Church at the close of the Second Century. For this reason alone it is of very great interest. It reveals the spirit of the Church in those far off times. In a letter written by the Roman lawyer, Pliny, to the Emperor Trajan, he mentions the fact that the Christians used to sing "hymns to Christ as to a god." No doubt during these times of bitter persecution, the Christians sang many hymns of which there is now no trace whatever. This one alone survives. Of Clement himself, not a great deal is known. He appears to have been of good birth and social position. Previous to his conversion to Christianity, he was a heathen philosopher. Eager for light, restlessness in his search for truth, he came into touch with Christianity in the city of Alexandria, and there his wanderings ceased. He became an enthusiastic believer, and when the head of the Catechetical School in that city left it to become a missionary, Clement was appointed to the position. There he remained until he was driven away by persecution in 202 A.D. Among his pupils at that time was the illustrious Origen. After that very little is known of his life.

The Maritime List of some 425 names appeared in the Halifax Herald of Nov. 11th. He says in part "Menin Gate was fitly chosen as the place of memorial for out of that gate most of those whose names are there enshrined, went forth to the battle front never to return. It stands at the head of the Menin Road, by which the enemy expected to enter Ypres as conquerors, and there on to the Channel ports. The memorial is one of simple grandeur. It is 135 ft. long, 105 ft. wide, and 77 ft. high. It consists of a double archway at each end, with a vaulted hall between. Over the centre of each arch is a panel with the inscription by Rudyard Kipling "To the armies of the British Empire who stood here from 1914 to 1918 and to those of the dead who have no known graves". The unveiling of this, the greatest memorial of the war, took place in the presence of the King of the Belgians and other notable personages. People crossed the channel by tens of thousands to look upon the gate, to pay their tribute to the loved ones it so fittingly honors and to participate in the dedication ceremonies. The address given by King Albert of Belgium was a glowing tribute to British fidelity and valor."

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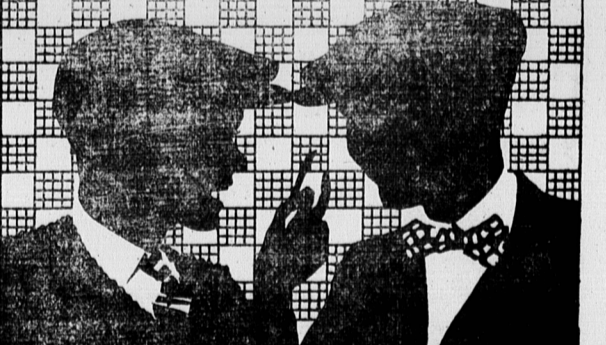
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Livestock Market

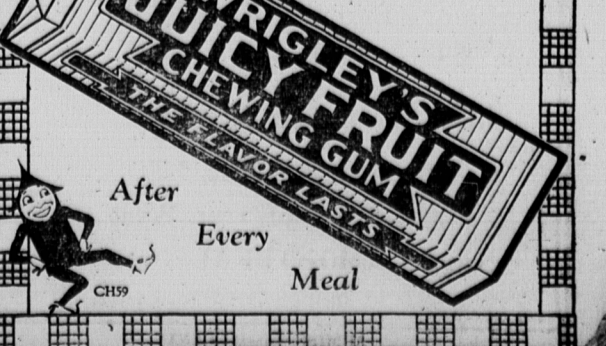

When she left Coalville she had booked passage on the Titanic, but at the last minute changed her plans. About her mysterious doings in the long interval during which her father and four brothers and sisters died, she would say little. She explained that she had married and done war work in Germany and had been captured by the Germans.

3,678 In An Hour

LONDON, Dec. 2.—Grace White, a dainty little school girl of thirteen of Wombwell in Yorkshire set up a new record recently by skipping 3,678 hops without a stop thus beating the record of 3,028 set up by an Irish girl, Kitty McHale.

The feat was performed before a large gathering.

Grace accomplished the achievement in 51 minutes 27 seconds, whereas the Irish girl took 52 minutes 30 seconds for fewer hops. After skipping 3,000 Grace began to ennuise the audience with a few fancy steps. Finally she skipped so fast that the referee had difficulty in keeping count. At a signal from her father she stopped voluntarily.
