The regular monthly meeting of the Summerside Town Council was held last night with the full Board present. The Town Clerk read the annual financial statement which appears elsewhere. A resolution was passed exempting Robinson's mills from taxation on \$6,000 for 10 years. Councillor G. M. Reid introduced a bye-law relating to licensing transient traders and laborers. Read a first time. Council adjourned to meet Monday Jan. 16.

The following financial statement of revenue and expenditure etc. of the Town of Summerside for the year ending Dec. 31, 1904, was submitted to the Council Board at the regular meeting last night by the Town Clerk. The auditors have completed their work and the accounts are now in the hands of the printers for publication.
