Wife Slayer Is Sentenced

(Canadian Press) CLARKSBURG W., Va., Dec. 12.—Harry F. Powers, Lothario of the West Virginia Hills, was convicted today of murder in the first degree for the "matrimonial racket" slaying of Mrs. Dorothy Pressler Lemke, Northboro, (Mass.), divorcee.

The verdict carries a mandatory sentence of hanging.

It took one hour and fifty minutes for the 12 farmers and small town business men to decide that the man who wooed dozens of women by mail should go to the gallows for the first of the five killings he is accused of perpetrating in the subterranean death chamber of his windowless, sound-proof garage at a place paradoxically called Quiet Dell.

J. Ed. Law, defense counsel, made a motion to have the verdict set aside. Arguments for a new trial will be heard Saturday.

Ethel Catherwood Gets Divorce

(Canadian Press) WASHINGTON, D. C., Dec. 12. Mat 1 and Empire this morning states that Ethel Catherwood, olympic high jumping champion, was divorced from her husband at Reno, Nev., six weeks ago. The marriage of Miss Catherwood was reported only today, but had, according to James McLaren, who claimed to be her husband, taken place two years ago. Miss Catherwood's mother today declared she did not even know her daughter's husband, and had known nothing of the wedding.

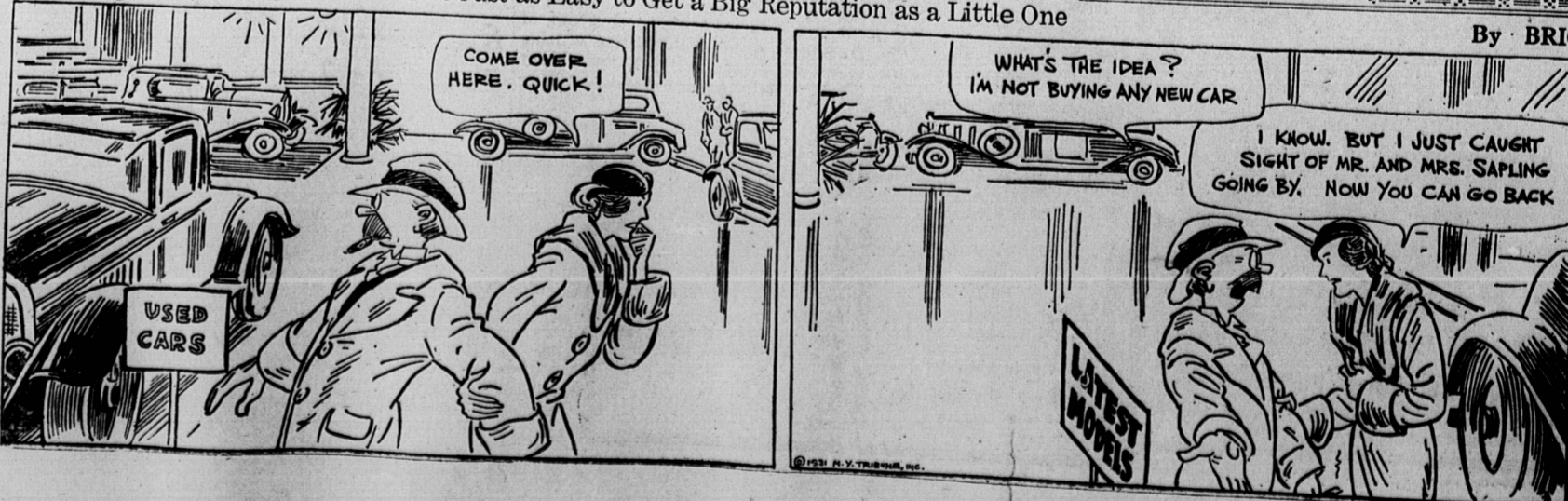

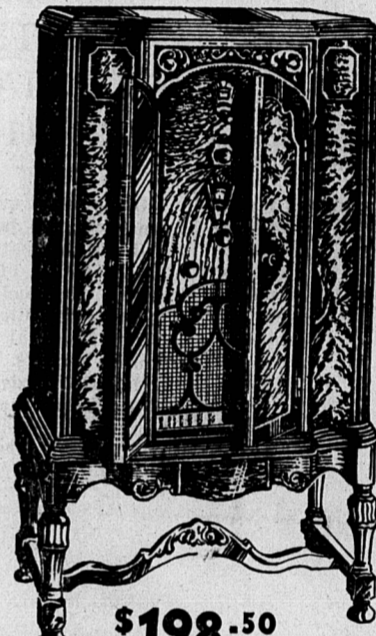

Wage Cut Dispute Grows More Involved

(Canadian Press) MONTREAL, Que., Dec. 12.—The Gazette today states that the position in the railway running trades wage cut dispute grows more involved with the information given by Senator James Murdoch, last night that, with one or two exceptions, such replies as have been received from the lodges, locals and districts which were asked to furnish information to the general conference of railway chairmen, have been in favor of taking a strike ballot.

"After full information is in from the lodges, the conference will then decide if a strike ballot will be circulated," the Senator is quoted as saying.
