In Montague yesterday dealers were paying forty-two cents a bushel for oats, twenty-two to twenty-five cents a bushel for potatoes, eighteen cents a dozen for eggs, ten and a half cents a pound for pork, twenty two cents a pound for butter and ten cents a pound for hides.

The first schooner of the season, the Dianthus, sailed from Montague yesterday with a full cargo for Cape Breton.
