RETREAT OF GLACIERS IN ROCKY MOUNTAINS MAKING CANADIAN WINTERS MILD

JASPER PARK LODGE, Alta., Aug. 11.—The general retreat of the glaciers of the Rocky Mountains is ample evidence that Canadian winters are becoming milder, according to Arthur O. Wheeler, A. F. R. G. S., Victoria, B. C., Honorary President of the Alpine Club of Canada and Canadian representative of the International Commission on Glaciers, who passed through Jasper last night on the Canadian National "Continental Limited" enroute east, following a study of the mighty Robson glacier. Accompanying Mr. Wheeler is H. E. Sampson, K. C., Regina, President of the Alpine Club.

Speaking of the Glacier which forms a silver crest on rugged Mount Robson, highest peak in the Canadian Rockies, Mr. Wheeler declared that the huge ice field has retreated 700 feet during the last twenty years. The Alpinist made observations at Robson in 1911 and his investigations of the past week have shown a remarkable change. At one time the water flowing

Unrecorded Islands Are Discovered

MOSCOW, Aug. 12.—Despatches today from the Soviet icebreaker Malign reported the discovery August 7 of four hitherto unrecorded islands in the far north region of the Franz Josef Archipelago.

Southwest of Karl Alexander Island the exploring vessel charted three unknown islands at 81.12 north latitude, 30.55 east longitude. The fourth is described as a small hilly bit of land in the straits of Baxa. They will be formally claimed in the name of Soviet Russia in the near future by the Arctic Institute, which will name them.
