Alder Dawson, the twelve year old son of Bruce Dawson, Victoria, who underwent an operation at the City Hospital is doing as well as can be expected.

Mrs. E. J. Lucas and Master Allan Lucas who have been spending the summer with Mrs. Capt. Finlayson returned yesterday to Halifax. They were accompanied by Miss Blanche Finlayson.

At the Fredericton Exhibition on Sept. 21 to 27 there will be three days trotting and pacing on the track adjoining Exhibition grounds and perhaps an additional day for non-winners.

President William MacKenzie, of the Canadian Northern Railway, stated several days ago that plans have been prepared for a new hotel and general office building at Winnipeg that will cost \$2,500,000, and if the structure is built, all Canada will be proud of it. The Grand Trunk Pacific and other railroads are being asked to join in the enterprise.

George Ham, the popular C. P. R. official, who has been seriously ill at his home in Montreal, has so far recovered as to be able to leave Montreal for a trip through the great lakes. Mr. Ham's popularity is shown by the fact that on the day that his serious illness was announced his private secretary had to answer fifty telegrams expressing regret at his misfortune and during the day following hundreds of letters were received.

St. John's Church, Windsor, will soon enjoy the services of another settled pastor, Rev. J. W. Crawford, Great Village, having accepted the call. J. A. Smith appeared as commissioner from St. John's congregation before the Frisco Presbytery on Tuesday, 10th. Mr. Smith presented the claims of Windsor in a capital, common sense, practical speech. Mr. Crawford will soon be settled in Windsor.—Windsor N. S. Ex. (Mr. Crawford is a native of Cardigan and is now visiting here).

C. Henry Dimock in his recent visit to Charlottetown, P. E. I., as delegate to the Baptist Convention convened there spoke very highly of the place. He had the pleasure of listening to a short address from the Rev. Wm. Dobson, who was present at the Convention, and he also attended the Methodist church, where he heard a good sermon, and some excellent music. Prof. Harry Wattis the organist, and he is highly spoken of. Mr. Dimock says the Convention was not as largely attended as usual, owing to the fact that the delegates had to pay their own expenses.—Hants Journal.
