Manual Laborer New Master Of National Household In Russia

Favored Son Of Soviet Rule Acts In Many Capacities And Receives Favoritism At Hands Of Bolshevik Leaders

MOSCOW, March 6.—The ascendancy of the manual laborer in the new Soviet civilization is not an abstract thing, not empty flattery of the new master of the national household. It is a reality affecting everything from the simplest matters of food and shelter to the most complex questions of arts, ideals and morals.

Electrifying All British Railways

LONDON, March 6.—The electrification of the entire railway system of Great Britain, the gigantic scheme on which a body of experts have been working for the past seventeen months, is approaching its first definite stage.

The committee under Lord Weir, which was appointed in September, 1920 to investigate the whole question of railway electrification, is nearing in favor of the scheme.

A conservative estimate of the cost of electrifying the 20,000 miles of main lines of railway in Great Britain has been put at one billion dollars.

The scheme, if adopted, would be carried out in stages. A beginning would be made with the suburban areas of the largest cities, London, Birmingham, Liverpool, Manchester and Glasgow.

Electrification would then be extended to main lines radiating from these dense centres of population and compressed industry, until the entire country became linked up by a general electrical system.
