Splendid Programme Will Mark Centennial Of East Point Church

Keen Interest Is Being Taken In Preparations For Observing 100th Anniversary Of Establishment Of Baptist Church At East Point.

Next week, commencing Tuesday evening and continuing until Sunday, July 16, the Centennial Anniversary services of the United Baptist Church at East Point, this Province, will be conducted.

Historic Sketch The centennial anniversary is also the occasion of the publication of a most interesting booklet, tracing the history of the East Point Baptist Church from its inception to the present time.

On Friday, July 12, 1833, a special service was held in the new building for the purpose of organizing a regular Baptist church, after the New Testament pattern.

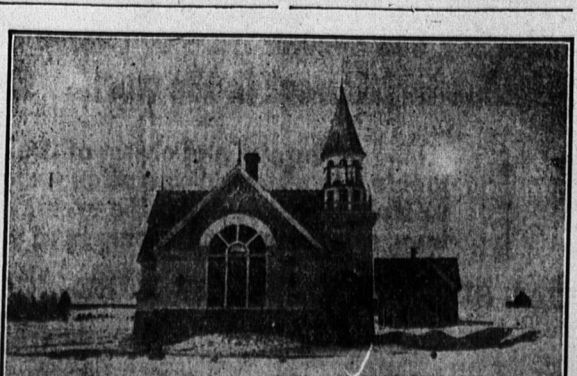
It is the story of Mrs. John Kennedy and Mrs. James MacDonald, who travelled on foot a distance of over fifty miles through a trackless wilderness to Three Rivers to secure a "preacher of the word."

First Baptisms Mr. Crawford finding the field ripe for the harvest, began without delay to hold special services. The first fruits of these services were Mrs. Kennedy and Mrs. MacDonald themselves. The baptism took place at South Lake, and was the first New Testament baptism to be administered in that region, and it made a profound impression.

During the ten years that followed, the work of the church moved on regularly and without special incident. Ministers from other sections visited the community and brought inspiring messages.

Incident. Ministers from other sections visited the community and brought inspiring messages. Rev. Edwin Clay, Rev. David McKeen and Rev. William Hall held revival services at different times, resulting in great good to the church as well as adding to the membership.

2nd Church Erected

In December, 1867, a movement was started to erect a large and more modern church edifice. In the intervening years the population had increased, and newcomers from the "old land" had arrived so that increased accommodations were necessary.

The next important step was the organization of the church. Up to this period there were meetings of the people, for worship and the transaction of business.

Thus the original Baptist Church of Kingsboro was launched. It emerged into history accompanied by no imposing ritual or compelling oratory. Its members were a modest democratic body.

For nearly two years after Mr. Shaw's retirement the church was without a pastor, but the regular services were profitably carried on by Deacon Scott with occasional visits from outside pastors.

North Lake Meeting House The meeting-house at North Lake was started in 1875 and finished in the following year.

In September, 1876, a call was extended to Rev. J. A. Gordon, (father of Mr. J. P. Gordon, Charlottetown), then of Alberton and West Cape, P. E. I., to become pastor.

The successful pastors, to whose Christian zeal and successful ministry tribute is also paid in the booklet under review, were: Rev. R. B. Kinley, 1881-1885; Rev. A. A. McLeod, 1886-1887; Rev. R. H. Bishop, 1887-1893; Rev. A. C. Shaw, 1894-1896; Rev. E. A. McPhee, 1896-1900; Rev. J. W. Gardiner, 1900-1906; Rev. G. H. Beaman, (first union pastor of both churches; started on May 19, 1907) 1907-1908; Rev. Hugh T. Morrison, 1909-1910; Rev. G. F. Camp, 1910-1912; Rev. W. R. Bell, 1912-1914; Rev. W. E. Pigeon.
