IN MEMORIAM
ETTA LAMIRA MILLER.

The home of Mr. and Mrs. Thomas A. Millar, Murray road, Souris, was made very sad on Friday, Sept. 21, when the angel of death called away their only child, Etta Lamira, at the tender age of two years and eight months. She had been sick but a few days, and yet from the very first it was feared that human skill could do little to save her life, as her disease was a very bad case of diphtheria. But the disease could not be mastered, and the little one went away to Jesus to await a glad reunion with the sorrowing ones who miss her in their home. On Saturday the neighbours gathered as near the home as was considered advisable, and there received the little casket from the hands of the heart-broken father and grandfather. The procession to the cemetery was a very sad one, and during the short graveside service many sympathetic tears were shed for those who parted with their darling at the gateway of their home. At the time of this writing, the necessary cleaning precautions have been completed and the quarantine restrictions removed from the home of Mr. and Mrs. Millar, and they are receiving many expressions of deep sympathy from the people of the community who have called.

BILL OF CREDIT ADDED TO CRIPPLES' PENSIONS

Men who incur disabilities in army service which require special appliances such as orthopaedic shoes, trusses, rubber bandages and belts, will be given a bill of credit in addition to their pensions for the yearly purchase of such articles, by an arrangement made between the Military Hospitals Commission and the Board of Pensions Commissioners.

"We have so arranged," explained Secretary E. H. Scamell following the announcement, "that a man may purchase such appliances and forward the bill to the Commission. His needs having been appraised and the fair cost of such articles estimated, this sum will be deducted from the amount granted him for the year, and if at the end of the term there is a balance it will be given to him.

"In case of an artificial limb of course the Government is manufacturing them itself, and all necessary changes will be taken care of without expense to the man but with minor appliances this new arrangement is thought to be the most satisfactory both to the man and the government.
