London is about to erect a statue to John Milton. The design represents the great poet walking in his garden, apostrophizing the Spirit, and the following lines from Paradise Lost are to be engraved on the pedestal:
 "O Spirit what in me is dark
 Illumine, what is low raise and support;
 That to the height of this great argument
 I may assert eternal Providence,
 And justify the ways of God to men."

The New York Times after a careful review concludes that Russia has about 250,000 troops on hand and available for a fight in Manchuria, if that shall be the battleground. If the land operations are to take place there Japan would be outnumbered. If in Korea, Japan would have the preponderance of numbers, as a considerable part of the Russian force would be required to guard her lengthened line of communications.

A subscriber inquires whether the Japanese are under the same restrictions as the Chinese with regard to their admission to China. They are not. The present tax on Chinese is \$100 per head. The British Columbia Legislature has sought to restrict both Chinese and Japanese immigration in various ways, but that power rests with the Dominion authorities and the Columbian acts were disallowed. There is no capitation tax on Japanese but the Japanese Government has given an undertaking not to grant passports to its people who desire to immigrate to Canada. This has checked the movement. Japanese even after becoming British subjects are not permitted to vote in British Columbia.

Premier Ross has apparently no intention of throwing up the sponge, but will fight unto the last. And yet some of the strongest Liberal journals in Ontario freely express the opinion that the Government has lost the support of the country. Among them the Ottawa Free Press, a strong Liberal paper, says:
 "No other conclusion is possible than that the ministry as now constituted has lost the confidence of the electors." "The electors of North Renfrew have plainly written across the record of Mr. Ross's government, as presented to them, 'mene tekel' and it is evident from the manner in which the verdict has been received that it very largely reflects the opinion of the body of the province."
 "It is useless for the Liberal party of the province to shut its eyes to the fact that things cannot remain as they are for any length of time."

The British naval program for 1903-4 is the construction of three first-class battle ships each of 16,350 tons displacement, 18,000 horse power and a speed of 18½ knots; four cruisers each of 13,550 tons, 23,500 horse power and 22½ knots speed; four scouts of about 2,700 tons, 10,000 horse power and 25 knots speed, together with 15 torpedo boat destroyers of 25½ knots speed and ten submarine torpedo craft. This is in addition to five battleships King Edward, Commonwealth, Dominion, Hindostan and New Zealand now under construction. Each of these eight battleships will carry four 12-inch and four 9-inch guns in six turrets; ten 6-inch rapid fire guns in battery; forty smaller guns and four submerged torpedo tubes. The new cruisers will each carry six 9.2-inch guns in turrets, ten 6-inch rapid fire guns in battery besides twenty-eight smaller rapid fire guns. Each of the "scouts" will carry ten 3-inch guns.
