THE CANADIANS UNDER FIRE.

One hundred men of the Canadian Contingent have at length been under fire. Our Island boys were not in the engagement, though no doubt they would gladly have borne a part. Our despatches tell the story in some detail, showing that 100 of the western Canadians, joined with a body of Queenslanders and regulars, after a long march surprised the enemy and captured the Boer laager and 40 prisoners. We are told that the colonial troops and regulars worked admirably together and the entire movement was most successful.

Fortunately there were very few casualties on the British side and none among the Canadians. We may now hear any day of the entire Canadian Regiment being engaged with the enemy. They are evidently thought now to be sufficiently drilled for active work.

Governor Daly of Nova Scotia was made a K. C. M. G., by the Queen on New Year's day, and is now Sir Malachi Daly.

That was a report from Pretoria, and consequently unreliable, which told that Ladysmith is short of ammunition. All that Pretoria knows of Ladysmith is what is told by the cannon's mouth.

A Methodist chaplain will be sent with the second Canadian Contingent. The General Superintendent of the Methodist body has been asked to send in three or four names from which the Government will make a selection.

Our despatches of this morning not only confirm the first report of Gen. French's victory at Colesburg, but lead to the belief that its results may be more important than was at first believed. The Boers having retreated to the eastward, Gen. French now commands their line of communication with the Orange State. His victory must also relieve the pressure in front of Gen. Gatacre and make it easier for the latter to advance.
