TORONTO, Dec. 21 — Following a series of quarrels in a room in the rear of a shoe shine parlor located at 1980 Queen Street West, Sam Tellefson, proprietor of the establishment, is now in the Western Hospital with a bullet lodged in his stomach, and his assailant, whose name at present is unknown to the police, is in the same hospital with a bullet through his head.

Quarrelling, followed by reports of four revolver shots, were heard by people in an adjoining store and when the police broke into the room the two wounded men were found and hurriedly removed to the hospital.
