Synopsis of Canadian Northwest Land Regulations

THE sole head of a family or any issue over eighteen years old, may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. Application must be made in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the District. Entry by proxy may be made at any Dominion Lands Agency but not Sub-Agency on certain conditions. A settler who has exhausted his homestead right may take a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$150 per acre. Duties must be paid in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres, on certain conditions. A habitable house is required except where residence is performed in the vicinity. In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section along side his homestead. Price \$1.00 per acre. Duties six months residence in each of three years after earning homestead patent; also 50 acres extra cultivation. Free-emption patent may be obtained as soon as homestead patent, on certain conditions. A settler who has exhausted his homestead right may take a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$150 per acre. Duties must be paid in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres, on certain conditions. A habitable house is required except where residence is performed in the vicinity. In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section along side his homestead. Price \$1.00 per acre. Duties six months residence in each of three years after earning homestead patent; also 50 acres extra cultivation. Free-emption patent may be obtained as soon as homestead patent, on certain conditions.

CANADA'S "DICKY BIRDS" IN THE WAR ZONE

The news from the different seats of war, from the correspondents has often lately contained reference to the "Dicky Birds" which is the pet name given by the boys on the different fronts to the members of the Royal Flying Corps. It now seems likely to become equally well-known as the pet name of the Royal Flying Corps of Canada.

This is the new Canadian unit for the organization of which officers and non-coms. of the Imperial Corps are now in Canada, not only to have the equivalent built here, but also to enlist the necessary members and carry on the instructions and training at different places in the Dominion. Through the splendid response of those that recognize their responsibility to the call of the National Service Board for this service, the Flying Corps should be raised in a very short time.

From the National Service cards of men living in the Province of Ontario over 12,000 likely names have been obtained and particulars as to the R. C. are being sent to them in order to give them the opportunity to join. For the present the call will be confined to the Eastern Provinces.

turners, besides male clerks, engineers, storemen, cooks, laborers and officer's servants.

The Flying Service is different from all others on account of the large number of non-commissioned officers attached to same. Although a man enlists for ground work only, there is nothing to prevent him taking part in aerial work if he so desires afterwards, and is found capable. This means promotion and increased pay. The advantages of joining their corps are many. Men who have tried to enlist in the infantry and who have been turned down on account of flat feet or not being able to stand marching or for their usual physical disabilities, or who perhaps could not join up on account of home ties, have here a splendid opportunity to take part in the national defence. The work is most interesting, and will not be carried on in the machine shops in the cities, but at the different squadron headquarters and air-bases. In fact, for a man whose health is not strong, but who in the past has been able to do his work in a city shop, it will be the best experience he can get from the health-building point of view, and there is no heavy marching and heavy equipment, as in the other branches of the Service.

The duties of the men of this corps will be to re-build and repair, and keep the machines that will be made in Canada, in first class order for the flying pilots, and it will give everyone in it an insight and a course of instruction in what is going to be the world's future method of transportation to a great extent. By the time, the war is over, the members of the Royal Flying Corps Service in every branch probably will be in such demand that their opportunities for future advancement will be similar to that of those of electrical men at the beginning of the development of that industry, at high wages and high positions.

The rate of pay is also very fair, and includes free lodging, clothing, food and a separation allowance (if married). In fact to a man who rises to the rank of sergeant, (and there are far more in the Flying Corps than in other units) it equals an income of about \$25 per week or \$1,300 per year. The pay being \$14 per week an enlisted man should save \$6 per week, at least on food and clothing.

The lowest rate of pay is for those who have enlisted as third class air mechanics, or unskilled men. They draw \$11.10 per day besides the other allowances, but the majority of the men, that is those who pass the trade test, will be enlisted as second class air mechanics at \$13.25 per day, with a prospect of rapid promotion to warrant officers, at \$2.80 per day. Only 3,000 are needed for this corps and for a young man, or even a middle-aged man, who cannot serve in any other capacity, it is a grand opportunity, to take part in the defence of his country, and at the same time, learn an occupation that he can continue as his future livelihood at a very good rate of remuneration.

Those enlisting are intended for ground duties only and are not required to fly. Their sole duties are as already stated. Our Canadian Overseas pilots have done wonders through their sterling ability, and wonderful nerve and the Royal Flying Service has now recognized that Canada deserves the honour of having squadrons of its own. The National Service Board desires those who wish to join the corps to apply at once to the chief recruiting officers of the district they reside in. Those who do not reside near such an office can secure full particulars by addressing inquiries to the National Service Board at Ottawa.

DEMAND PRIVILEGES FOR EAST INDIANS

TORONTO, March 6.—A deputation from the Canada India League, composed of J. E. Dobbs and Dr. L. A. Davis, visited Ottawa and laid before Hon. Dr. Roche, Minister of Interior, a petition asking that all reasonable regulations that will facilitate the restoration of family life to East Indians now domiciled in Canada be immediately placed in operation. It was also asked that, as technically, tourists, merchants and students from East India are permitted to enter the Dominion the obstacles that have confronted them when attempting to avail themselves of this technical privilege be removed; that the Dominion Government exert influence on the Government of British Columbia to have the Government grant equal suffrage to East Indians resident in the province, and that East Indians be allowed to enjoy at least the more favorable provisions extended to Japanese citizens. The Minister promised to give the petition his careful consideration.

German Americans Spent Millions in Dabbling Mexico

WASHINGTON, March 6.—Millions of dollars have been sent to the Carranza government of Mexico recently by Germans in the United States, it was learned on high government authority today. Some of these millions in the form of "personal loans" to Mexico. Other millions went into the purchase of smelter plants wherever available in Carranza's republic. The money was sent in spite of warnings by the United States that such "loans" would not have the support of this government, unless all conditions of the arrangements between the loaning parties and Carranza met with the approval of Washington.

This was one of the countless developments which began coming to light today, following official disclosures by President Wilson and Secretary Lansing of a carefully planned plot to unite Mexico and Japan with the Imperial German government in a war on the United States.
