Tanton, Jeweler, that of third place the large silver butter cooler by the Canada Cycle and Motor Co., Ltd., the fourth place an exceedingly neat silver metal by W. H. Moran, of the Union Commercial College, and the fifth place one half dozen cabinet photos by J. A. S. Bayer of Gauvin Gensel & Co. There are no restrictions as to the kind of bicycle to be used providing it is not propelled by other than the rider.

On Thursday at St. John the visiting delegates to the Board of Trade and their lady friends were taken for a sail up the St. John river. There were nearly three hundred in the party. The St. John Sun has the following about the Island delegates: There was an air of mystery and expectancy when George Robertson, M. A most enthusiastic Liberal-Conservative Convention was held in this City yesterday for the purpose of naming the candidates to contest East and West Queens at the next Dominion election. The present members Alex Martin, M. P., and Angus McLean, M. P. were unanimously nominated. There were speeches by both gentlemen, and a number of the delegates present spoke. Several important resolutions were passed regarding the policy of the party and other matters such as The Tunnel, Good Government, An Experimental Station, Graft, and The Postal Service.

The fine sailing yacht Adrienne, in which D H Robb, her owner, president of the Robb Engineering company, was sailing from Charlottetown to the Cumberland coast, on Sunday, with a party on board, met with quite a serious mishap. Those on board were: D W Robb captain; Roland H Robb, mate; Mrs D H Robb and daughter, Miss Vera; Miss Mable Pugsley, Dr Gerald Bliss, and D Wendall Robb, all of Amherst. The Adrienne left here last Sunday and in the afternoon met a strong head wind. When off Oak Island the stern stay parted, and before this could be repaired, the foremast gave way carrying with it the mainmast, and rendered the yacht helpless. Anchorage was made in eleven fathoms of water and the wreckage cut away, when, the night being dark, and a high sea running, it was decided not to land till morning. A comfortable night was spent and in the morning a temporary sail was rigged, under which the yacht made Wallace Harbor, where the party landed without having suffered any injury. The Adrienne has been towed to Picton for repairs.

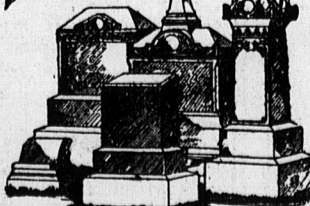
