HORSE NOTE.

The "Plain Kind"—A man or horse, soldier or civilian, statesman or clergyman, race horse or speed squire, it is the plain, unassuming kind that "get there" and "deliver the goods." The most noted descendants of Hambletonian 10, the ones which have proven most prolific in speed production, in both the male and the female line, as well as the ones which have "gathered in the money" and made new records, have been of the plain sort, the sort which do not attract excessive, spontaneous attention on account of individual rarity and charming appearance, yet whose individuality, when analyzed and studied, can hardly be criticised. This was true of Hambletonian himself, of George Wilkes, Electioneer, Robert McGregor, Alexander's Abolition, Onward, Red Wilkes at May and other present day, celebrated speed and others of the older sires, and it is equally true sires, Agri, the trotting stallion owned by J.M. Nicholson, Charlottetown, is not an "eye catcher" at a casual glance on account of conspicuous beauty, and yet, when one looks him over carefully and studiously, he is found to be an individual giant on the sum total of points and qualities which go to make up a really great and extraordinary sire and stock horse. Agri was raced a little last year as a five year old to see if he would do in company. The test was satisfactory and he will be liberally staked this season.

AMERICAN PROPOSALS.

LONDON, Feb. 15.—America is gaining considerably experience of the delays of British diplomacy, particularly in matters in which colonies are interested and have to be consulted. The replies of two proposals of the state department, in those suggesting the calling of conferences on the open question in the Pacific, and for the regulation of sealing in the Pacific, are being help up by India and Canada respectively.

When the proposal for the sealing conference reached the foreign office, through the American embassy, it was immediately sent to the colonial office and thence to Canada with a request that the Canadian government give their views in regard to it. The foreign office is still awaiting Canada's reply, for until it comes Great Britain cannot answer the state department.

A similar course has been adopted with the suggestion for another opium conference, the Indian office and India having been consulted, in place of the colonial office and Canada, and the same delay having resulted.

Another cause, the general election and consequent pre-occupation of the members of the cabinet is responsible for the delay in replying to Mr Knox's proposal that the international prize court, established by the Hague conference, have its powers enlarged so as to become a permanent court of arbitration.

MARCONI TO HAVE TRY AT INLAND WIRELESS.

NEW GLASGOW, N. S., Feb 16.—Within a month possibly, I expect the wireless station Port Morien to be able to handle all commercial business offering for transmission across the Atlantic and then I will turn my attentions to inland business. "Chevalier Marconi stated to a reporter today on his way to Morien where he will superintend the opening of the new station now under construction to replace the one destroyed by fire last year. Marconi passed through here today and he will be in Cape Breton three weeks or a month.

He proceeded to refer to the time when the farmers of this province and of Canada enjoyed a preference in the British market, greatly to their advantage. He criticised the efforts to secure immigrants, which had so far resulted in very little so far. In regard to cold storage, he said the Dominion Government had taken charge of it, not only in transit but in warehouses. The provincial government should have called the attention of the Ottawa war office to this matter, as cold storage to be of any use must be continuous from the place of production to the market. He hoped the Experimental Farm would turn out well. There had once been great hopes of the Stock Farm, but under the present government it had come to desolation. At last it was almost a blessing to close it down and hand it over to the Asylum. If the management of the Experimental Farm is no better it will end in the same way. But he hoped for the best. He noted that in some other provinces they had not been called to pay for the land on which Experimental Farms are located, as had been the case here. What was wanted

Marconi said that from now on private business by the transatlantic stations in Cape Breton, and Ireland. The experiments which have occupied the entire capacity of these stations since they were erected are now well advanced, permitting more time to be devoted to transmitting business messages.

ment in regard to what had been done about our claims.

He would not say that any material progress had been made. Things were pretty nearly where they were twenty years ago, despite the efforts of successive Governments to collect them. It is not all plain sailing. It is easy to make up claims, but not so easy to convince the Government of Ottawa. One Province could not solve this question alone. As to the claim on account of the failure of winter navigation, it is claimed that the Federal Government had never consented to divide up the money. He had tried to get other Provinces to join in pressing these claims, but both Nova Scotia and Quebec were reluctant. One Province could not solve this question alone.
