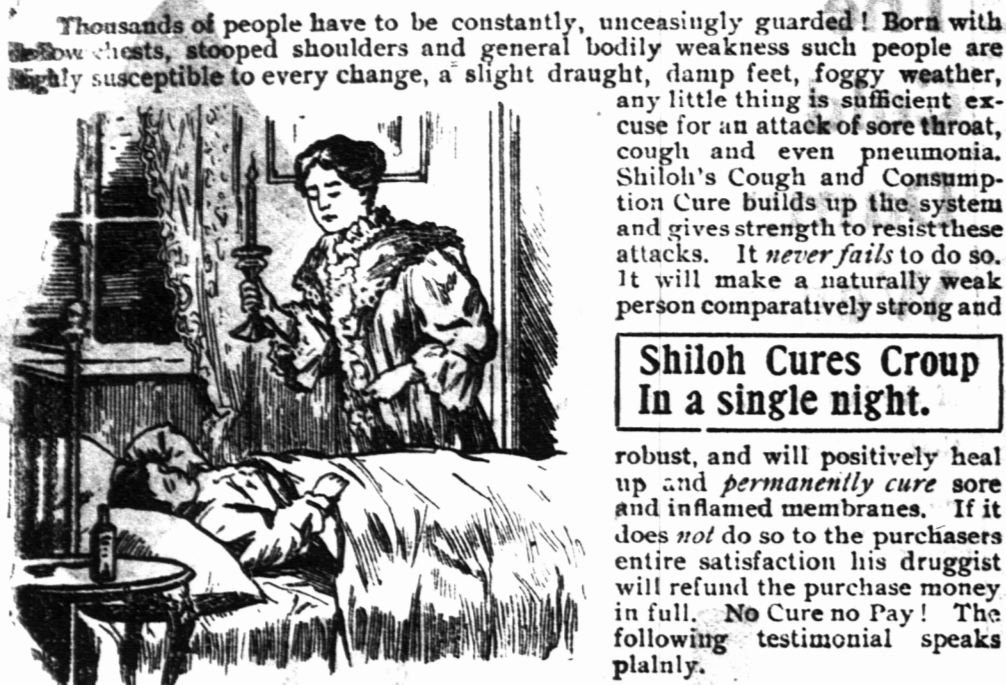

WESTERN CAPITAL Summerside and Prince County News.

The schooner Howard L., Capt. Farrow, arrived in S'side yesterday evening, coal laden for New London.

Mr. John Dickieson picked up a small sum of money a few days ago and as he has no use for it he will cheerfully hand it over to the owner if he should care to have it.

Mr. John A. Sharp, of Summerside, and Gilbert DesRoches, Miscouche, were nominated as the standard bearers of the Conservative party at a meeting held on Monday night. On Tuesday evening the Liberal nomination was tendered Hon. Angus McMillan but was refused. Messrs R. C. McLeod and George Godkin were then nominated, and it is understood they have accepted the nomination.

The gale and snowstorm on Tuesday night and yesterday morning are reported to have been very much more severe on the New Brunswick coast than on the Island. At Point du Chene a Norwegian barque loaded and ready for sea which was lying off the mouth of the harbor was driven ashore during the night and is supposed to be considerable damaged. The Northumberland did not leave for Summerside until yesterday morning at 10 o'clock arriving here about noon.

Rev. J. M. Withycombe leaves this morning by the Northumberland for a visit to Cleveland, Ohio, and expects to return in a week or ten days. It is currently rumored that he has received a call from an important church in that City and although no public intimation has been given by himself it is generally believed. Should this prove to be so, it will be a distinct loss not to Summerside alone, but to the Province although no doubt a decided advantage to himself.

ore could not afford to give the brightest ideas at this time. The Senate represented the higher plane of Canadian public life. He spoke highly of the Commons Committee on Agriculture and the fine work it had accomplished. He also cited as a fine instance of governmental paternalism the work that had been done in fostering the dairy industry in P. E. Island. His friend Hon. John Carling had set it in motion when he was Minister of Agriculture and had kept politics out of it altogether. He selected Prof Robertson, then a Liberal, to conduct the work and from the beginning, until the Government retired and left the factories to their own direction the hand of partisanship never touched the dairy industry. (Cheers.)

At this stage the chairman called upon Mr. C. R. Smallwood to read some letters of regret, which he did, the letters being from Mr. Longworth of Nova Scotia and Premier Tweedie of New Brunswick. The toast to the Provincial Legislature was coupled with the names of Premier Farquharson and Hon. John Dryden who spoken the order named. Mr. Farquharson jocularly remarked that he was called to respond for something that did not exist as our Legislature had been dissolved. He thanked the distinguished visitors for their presence in the name of the people of P. E. Island. They came from larger Provinces but he believed our farmers were, man for man as intelligent as those of any other Province. (cheers) Why should they not be when we expended nearly half the revenue of the Province for the support of education. In conclusion he spoke of Messrs. Dryden, Elderkin, Courtney and Grisdale in highly complimentary terms which were heartily applauded.

Hon. John Dryden, who was warmly received, said that from their complimentary language he was led to think that both the Chairman and the Premier were Irishmen. In speaking for the Legislature of Ontario he said he had been a member of that body for nearly 22 years, and during all that time and for years before one party had been in power. But, though their opponents thought it was time for them to step out it was to be remembered that the government had entirely changed its personnel in that time. All the ministers were different men from what they were when he entered the House. He claimed that the Ontario Legislature had in it many wise and eloquent men of whom his leader, Premier Ross was foremost. They had a go-ahead spirit and had recognized that agriculture was their foremost industry, the great creator of wealth. Gold mines might be worked out but the farms of the country were an ever increasing source of wealth, (cheers). The government saw this and set apart one of their number as Minister of Agriculture. He thought P. E. Island should do the same. The Ontario Legislature had given the people excellent laws. They gave the people manhood suffrage and education free to all. He contended that true education would not lead young men to desert the farm. Some of the high schools perhaps did this, but they had established an Agricultural College at Guelph which was educating young men in the direction of their life work and making them proud that they were farmers. He asked the farmers to hold up their heads and respect themselves. If they did not do so they would not be respected. In conclusion he would give them just three words as necessary to the development and progress of the great farming industry. These three words are Education, Organization, Co-operation. (Cheers)

Judge Warburton in proposing the Department of Agriculture spoke of the need of a department of that name in this Province. He claimed that it should be educational and not political, with Prince of Wales College at its head and the Stock Farm as a model farm connected, so that both the science and the practice of agriculture might be taught and exemplified. We were training our school pupils in line for Prince of Wales College and away from their proper calling in life. One half of one per cent of them reached the College. He coupled with the toast the name of Messrs. W. F. W. Hodson, Dominion Live Stock Commissioner and R. Robertson and J. H. Grisdale.

Mr. Hodson in replying spoke of the conditions and prospects of the live stock industry in British Columbia and Alberta. Both will be great stock regions in the future because of their climate and the abundance of grazing privileges. Alberta has now 200,000 horned cattle and will have ten times that number in a few years. They require to purchase yearly a large number of breeding males which the eastern Provinces ought to supply. They also require young cattle which they can grow and fatten. Last year in Ontario 40,000 calves were knocked in the head when born which were greatly needed in the West. Alberta would now take 10 to 15 thousand yearly if they could be got. The C. P. R. now
