FROM letters received in the city from James Paton, the following account of the wreck of the S. S. Merion on which were Mr. Paton and the other city merchants on their way to England for their respective firms. On Sunday evening March 1st shortly after the passengers for Ireland were landed and the steamer had turned toward Liverpool, nearly opposite Roache's Light House she struck a rock. The Captain did everything in his power but was unable to move the steamer from the reef on which she had stuck fast. Mr. Paton and party remained on the wrecked steamer until Tuesday owing to the high sea which was running preventing a tug from coming near. The baggage was afterwards conveyed to shores in life boats. Four attempts were made to have the Merion off the rock but were failures. On Thursday two tugs were made fast to the steamer and for two hours they worked but without avail. The life-boats were got ready for use in case they would be needed. It was an anxious time but every one acted carefully. The passengers waited upon the Captain in the library of the steamer and expressed their sympathy for him in his trying position. "I think he is an excellent man," writes Mr. Paton, "and the Company did, as they always do, and spared neither pains nor money in using the passengers well."
