

GLASS PAVING.

PARIS, April 29.—The municipality is experimenting with glass paving material. A section of Rue du Havre has been laid with it as a test. It is pure glass subjected to a process called devitrification. The result is a hard smooth opaque, non-porous substance which does not retain damp or odours. It possesses remarkable resistance. The inventors claim that it combines the solidity of granite with the smoothness of asphalt. It is not affected by heat or cold. It however is expensive costing from nine to twelve francs per square metre. Another drawback is its extreme resonance.

BREAD RIOT IN LIMBERG.

LEMBERG Galicia, April 29.—A riotous mob of the city unemployed today raided the bread booths at the market place, shouting "give us bread or work." The mob paraded the streets, breaking shop windows.

SHAMROCK II GROUNDED.

GLASGOW, April 29.—It transpires that the Shamrock II, grounded on a mud bank near Dumbarton, while proceeding seaward on Saturday. Her crew were transferred to a tug, and tightened the yacht floated after having been ashore three quarters of an hour. It is believed she is not injured.

EDUCATING THE NATIVES.

SAN JUAN, De Porto Rico, Ap 11 29. The United States transport Sedgewick sailed yesterday for New York, having on board nineteen Port Rico youths who are going to the United States to be educated. Eleven of them are bound for the United States government Indiana training school at Carlisle, Pa. The government will assume the expenses of the eleven students.

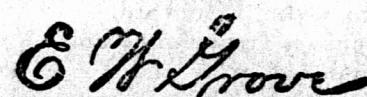
