She belonged to a family of twelve, and is survived by the youngest brother, Louis Huestis, Charlottetown, P. E. Island. Three weeks ago her eldest brother, John Strong Huestis of Albany, P. E. I. preceded her to the "Better World." She belonged to a very musical family, and will be remembered by many in leading the music in the social service of the Methodist church for many years. Up to the last she would sing the old tunes her father taught, and her countenance beamed with heavenly light, showing her beautiful Christian character. Two of her family, William Bradley and Anna Kate, have gone on before, while young in years. Those now living are three daughters and three sons—Mrs. Goode of this town; Mrs. W. P. Willis, Waltham, U. S. A.; and Mrs. D. Holmes, Yarmouth, N. S.; Walter Palmer, Dominion Parole Officer of the Department of Justice, Ottawa; Herbert Huestis, Manager of People's Bank, Bridgewater, N. S.; and Fred Willis, Professor of Music, Waltham U. S. A.; and a large number of grandchildren. She is survived by her aged partner, W. P. Archibald well known in this town. The funeral will be Tuesday morning at ten o'clock, from the Pleasant Street Methodist church. The deceased is a first cousin of the Rev. Geo. O. Huestis, Lunenburg, N. S.; Rev. Dr. S. F. Huestis, Halifax, and Mrs. Annie Fulton, Queen St. Truro.—Truro Sun.

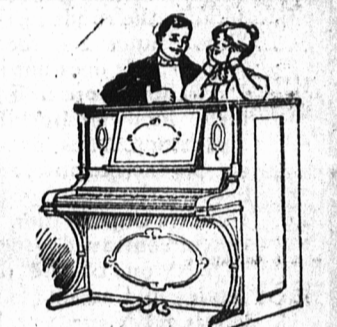
