Streets in Paddington — one of the West London boroughs, are hung with streamers "Spend for Employment." Posters remind the over-thrifty that "idle money idle hands," that.

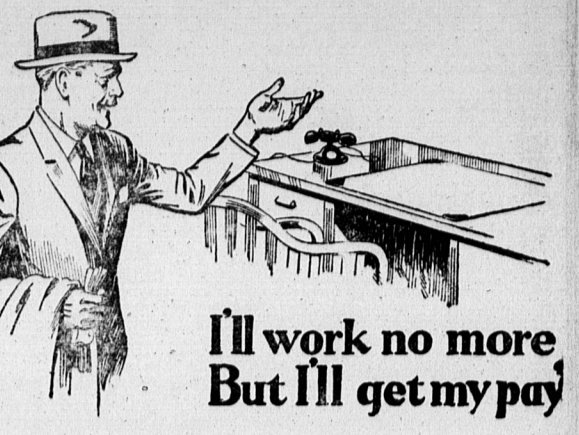

K. of C. And Children of Mary Pay Tribute To Beloved Rector On Eve of Departure For Tracadie.

PRESENTATION
St. Rev. Maurice McDonald, retiring Rector of St. Dunstan's Basilica who leaves on Tuesday to take up his new duties as parish priest at Tracadie, was the recipient yesterday of an address and presentation from the Knights of Columbus and from the Children of Mary. The presentations in each case took the form of a well filled purse, accompanied by the sincere good wishes of the donors.

The address on behalf of the Knights of Columbus was made in the K. of C. Hall by Grand Knight, Alban Farmer, the presentation being made by Deputy Grand Knight A. A. Hennessey.

Monsignor McDonald expressed his very warm appreciation in a brief address. Other speakers were Mr. Justice Arsenault, Hon. W. J. P. MacMillan, M. D., Rev. M. E. Francis, Messrs. S. F. Doyle, Sixtus MacLellan, Joseph Francis and F. J. Casey.

Sask. Govt. To Cut Expenditures By \$3,000,000

REGINA, Feb. 25.—The governmental expenditures in Saskatchewan for the year ending April 30, 1934, will be reduced by nearly \$3,000,000, according to estimates tabled in the Legislature. Estimated expenditures for the fiscal year ending April 1933, are given as \$21,927,303 with estimated revenues of \$21,958,797.

For the fiscal year 1933-34 expenditures are estimated at \$18,976,715. All departments share in the reduced expenditures and revenues.

War Debts

WASHINGTON, Feb. 25.—(Associated Press)—Immediate plans for talking war debts with both Great Britain and France were disclosed tonight by Cordell Hull as he outlined for the first time the United States' objectives of foreign policy under Franklin D. Roosevelt.

The tall, gray-haired Tennessee Senator whom the incoming president has chosen for Secretary of State told newspapermen he had in appointment with Ambassador Paul Claudel of France for Monday afternoon and would see Ambassador Sir Ronald Lindsay of Great Britain soon.
