POLICE OFFICER RESIGNS.

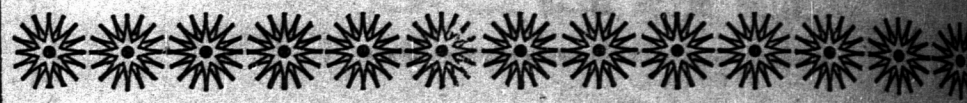
Moncton, Feb 28.—As the result of the

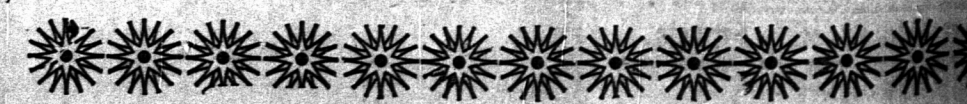
