BRYAN'S WAR CRY.

W. J. Bryan has been from the first somewhat famous as a phrase-maker. He first won the plaudits and the nomination of a Democratic convention by his famous but almost sacrilegious simile of the crown of thorns pressed down upon the brow of labor, and mankind being crucified upon a cross of gold. Today in accepting the nomination he rings out the battle cry, "Shall the people rule?" It is after all a rather taking war cry. It might be worth while asking the same question in Canada.

Do the people rule, either in the United States or in Canada? They verily believe they rule, but is their belief well-founded? There are so many things that the people want but do not get, and so many things that they get but do not want, and these go to make the question a pertinent one. True, the people think they choose their own representatives. As a matter of fact they have but little choice in the matter. A Conservative convention puts one man in the field and a Liberal convention puts up another, and the people in some sort choose between the two. But the Convention in three cases out of four is machine made.

Who makes the tariff of the country which touches us all so closely and takes so many dollars out of our pockets? Has not one big manufacturer more influence in shaping it than ten thousand farmers have? How many working men does it take to weigh against one railway magnate or coal baron, or steel king in the halls of Parliament? Think for a moment of the comparative influence of the working farmer and the millionaire campaign contributor in shaping legislation or administration and then say whether or no in our favored country the plain people rule the country.

Wherefore Mr. Bryan's question is a pertinent one, and as the people are everywhere in civilized countries awakening to the real condition of things, it may be that his war cry will rally not a few to his standard. And as for Canada, if the twentieth century is to be Canada's century in the best sense of the word, it will be because the masses of the people make up their minds to rule the country which is their heritage. But they will have to fight a sturdy battle, or the combination of the party machine with the greedy self-seekers and protected interests will rule the country in their stead.

SASKATCHEWAN ELECTION.

At this writing the result of the election in Saskatchewan is a surprise, not that the Scott Government has been sustained, but that its majority has been so nearly swept away. For the game was one in which the Government held so far as we can see, nearly all the trump cards. This will become apparent from a brief glance at the conditions existing. Premier Scott had in the first place the powerful assistance of the Dominion Government, and Sir Wilfrid Laurier had dealt most generously with the Province of Saskatchewan and its sister Province of Alberta.

Saskatchewan alone receives more subsidy from Ottawa than Nova Scotia, New Brunswick and Prince Edward Island together. The Province was equipped with costly public buildings at the cost of Canada. Out of its treasury it was able to pay its Cabinet Ministers \$6,000 each its Speaker \$1,500 and the members of the Legislature \$1,000 each. The Ottawa Government had promised to build the Hudson Bay Railway at a once, a work apparently valued as a new outlet much as our people would value the Tunnel. What more could the federal Government have done?

But this was but a part of the Ottawa Government's hold upon the electors. Its lands and immigration agents were everywhere in Saskatchewan. Probably over one half of the electors. Its land and immigration subject to its control or influence in the matter of unfulfilled conditions with regard to their lands, or for advances of seed grain not yet repaid. The Government stood in these matters in the relation of a creditor, with scores of agents on the spot to take cognisance whether the electoral debtors were friendly or unfriendly.

Premier Scott for his part had been lavish in promises of new local railways to every new settlement. Thus the power, patronage, influence and money of two Governments were working for success on the one side while the Opposition had nothing to give, and no means of controlling anybody. But the people had the ballot, and evidently were not satisfied with the way things are going, notably the way the timber lands, grass lands and fuel resources were being parcelled out among a favored few to the detriment of the many. Still the result under all circumstances must be regarded as surprising, and must be disappointing to the Liberal leaders. It is a note of warning from the prairies.
