The place in the goal made vacant by the removal of the beer that was destroyed has since been filled by another ten casks of what is suspected to be similar intoxicant, the nature of which is now being analyzed, these being seized during the last few days.

ENGLISH DISEASE EXPERT  
STUDIES TROPICAL DISEASE.

**COLON, Oct. 8.**—A study of the disease of pellegra in the West Indies is to be made by the British expert, Dr. Louis Westenia Sambon, of the London school of tropical medicine, who left here for Trinidad today, accompanied by Captain Joseph F. Siler, United States army medical corps, and A. H. Jennings, chief of the bureau of entomology at Washington. During his sojourn on the Isthmus Dr. Sambon kept in close touch with Colonel William C. Gorgas and found that fully fifty cases of pellegra had occurred on the Isthmus within the past three years, mostly among natives of Barbados and Jamaica.

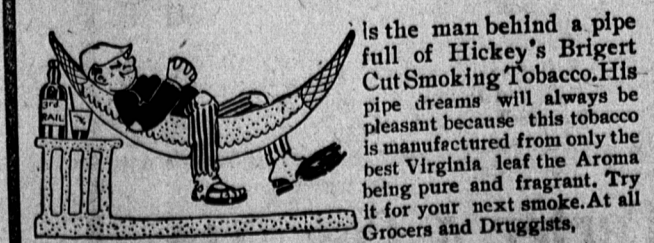
