NEEDS STILL INSISTENT.

Bishop Coadjutor Haddenley has made a visit to Cape Breton and investigated the actual state of affairs. His report is most heart-rending and convincing of the need for immediate and greater help. There are many families, at least 20,000 souls, mutely crying for food and clothing. Some of the most pathetic cases are those of people who, before the strike, were thought to be in comfortable circumstances, and whose self-respect prevented them from making their condition known. These have only been discovered by the indefatigable efforts of lady workers who search the districts for needy ones. In many of these cases, families had had no coal for several weeks and no food for days at a time. Many of the workers were earning such a small sum for weeks before the strike that they were compelled to spend all on necessary food, and so had nothing for clothes. The rags that held out for a time are now not enough to cover them, and they are suffering both from hunger and exposure. The straits in which these people have found themselves are as desperate as those of shipwrecked men on a desert island and yet they have restrained themselves and have kept law and order, notwithstanding the provocation of hunger and want. The Relief Committee of Glace Bay and Sydney Mines are in capable hands. Men and women of the best classes of the community, both clerical and lay, are working without charges and at a loss to their own business.
