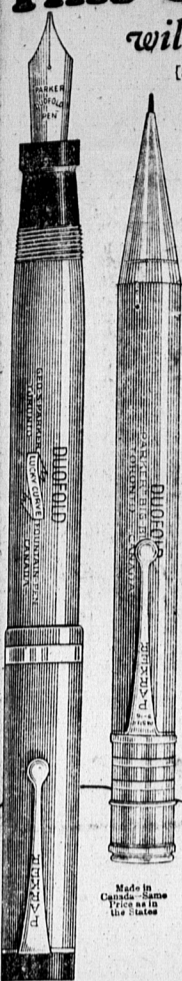

Dear Mr. Editor,—

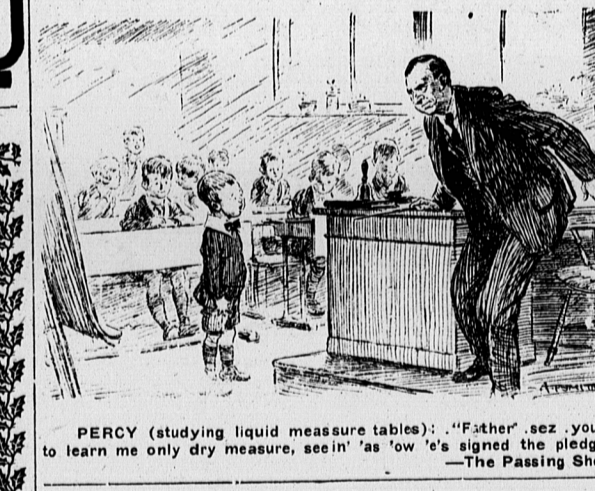

## Save Crushed Leg

NEW YORK, Dec. 18—Alex Carbone, 14 years old left Bellevue Hospital Saturday whole and sound. He entered the hospital September 18, being carried in by the driver of an automobile truck that had run him down. His right leg badly crushed and, it was said, would have to be amputated at once. Dr. Harry E. Martin, the house surgeon, disagreed with this and took personal charge of the case. In less than two months he performed nine operations transplanting 80 pieces of skin from the left leg to the crushed right leg. Alex stood the pain gamely.

## HOUSEHOLD HELPS

When the screw-holes of the knobs on dressers, sewing-machines, etc., become too large to hold the knobs tightly, dip a match in glue and hammer it lightly into the hole. Let it dry and then break off evenly with the drawer. Screw the knob in and it will hold securely.

When your shade becomes loose from the stick and no small tacks are handy, take adhesive tape, cut in small strips and attach the shade on stick. It holds quite as well as tacks and there is no danger of ruining the spring.

Here is a way to warm the bed of the invalid both safely and speedily. Into a Mason jar insert an electric light bulb which has been run through an opening in the cover of the jar. The warmth is just sufficient to be pleasant all night long, and it is absolutely safe.

It is quite easy to seal bottles so that there is absolutely no danger of their becoming uncorked in a suitcase or trunk. Ink, medicine, perfumes—may be treated by the same process. The trick is simply to light wax or tallow candle and carefully allow the melting substance to drop around the cork, rendering the bottle airtight and firmly sealing the stopper in place.

An emergency method of heating water is effected by placing your electric iron, inverted, on a stand. The current provides a heating surface which will quickly heat a pan or kettle of water.

By screwing wooden door-stops to the legs of the kitchen table, thus adding two inches to its height, the woman of five feet and over will find her work made much less tiresome, as she will be able to stand upright, instead of bending over.

Don't throw away old felt hats when the men of the family are through with them. The brims, cleaned and pressed flat, make heat proof mats which guard the finish of your dining-table.

Before putting away stovepipes in the spring, clean thoroughly within and without and rub vaseline on the outside. Cover with newspapers, stuff both ends, and place in a dry closet. To clean polished floors, sprinkle thickly with fine corn-meal. Use mop and scrub meal vigorously over floor. Then sweep off and the floors will look like new.

## LORD ADVOCATE FOR SCOTLAND.

Mr. Hugh Pattison Macmillan, K. C., whose appointment as Lord Advocate for Scotland has been approved by King George, has had a distinguished career at the Bar. He has the largest practice at the Scottish Bar, and is recognized as the leading advocate in Scotland.

Mr. Macmillan is the only son of the late Rev. Hugh Macmillan, D. D., LL.D., of Greenock, and was born on February 20, 1873. He received his education at Edinburgh University, graduating M. A. with first class honors in philosophy, later receiving the LL.B. degree from Glasgow University. He married, in 1901, Elizabeth Katherine Grace, daughter of the late Dr. W. J. Marshall, of Greenock. Mr. Macmillan began the practice of his profession as advocate at the Scottish Bar in 1897, and was Examiner in Law to Glasgow University from 1899 till 1904. From 1900 till 1907 he was editor of the "Juridical Review," and in 1918 he was appointed Assistant Director of Intelligence of the Ministry of Information.

From between Mr. Macmillan and Prime Minister Ramsay MacDonald it appears that the new Lord Advocate accepts the office on the basis that it will be non-political and without a seat in the House.
