Rev. J. F. Floyd, pastor of the Central Christian Church, city, preached to a large congregation on Sunday evening on the 5th Verse of the Decree, taking his text from Matthew 11: 6. He explained the meaning of the decree and what is implied in it. He thought there were two extremes on the subject of marriage, some holding it to be wholly a religious ceremony and others holding it to be simply a civil contract. Marriage was not a sacrament and yet it had a large religious element in it. It was not a ceremony for true marriage went back of all ceremony and might exist without any ceremony. The Bible specifies no ceremony. A ceremony was beautiful and appropriate but not necessary. The civil law should be in harmony, as far as possible, with divine law. While the text says, "What God hath joined together, let no man put asunder," yet the real question is, how does God unite the man and the woman in marriage. The trouble with the decree was that it came into conflict with the civil law regulating marriages and it application in the case of mixed marriages will result in family trouble. The real question is, shall the law of the country regulating marriage, which is not contrary to scripture, be obeyed or shall the decree override this law? Shall Rome or Britain rule in this Dominion. There can be but one true answer to this question, provided the ruling of Britain is right. A uniform law is needed for the whole of Canada that applies alike to every religious body, which should be permitted to have their own ceremony or their own method of uniting people in the marriage bond. The speaker recommended the avoiding of mixed marriages as much as possible, not that they were unlawful but because they were inexpedient.
