Starving People On Big Ocean Liner

Vessel Ran Short of Supplies When She Became Disabled—And the Passengers of Whom there Were Many Had to Go Hungry

Boston, May 31.—Disabled by the breaking of her "Thrust Pin" when six hundred miles east of Boston Light and with 1,348 Russians and Polish immigrants suffering the pangs of hunger and thirst from having subsisted two days on short rations of salt pork and water, the steamship Korea, of the Russian Eastern Asiatic S.S. Co., was discovered off Boston Light, flying signals of distress. The signals of a somewhat unusual order, began with a message "May we enter your port" and was followed by "Bad News" and several other messages, all to convey the information there was trouble aboard.

He stated, however, that if the ship were found so badly disabled that any considerable delay was necessary here, he would disembark the passengers here and send them on to New York by rail.

A careful investigation was made by the immigration officials for fear that among the immigrants as a result of the unsanitary conditions, and food served to the passengers the past two days, besides the 1,348 Russians Polish steerage passengers, the Korea brought over fifteen second cabin passengers.

CONSIDERING NEGRO PROBLEM

New Effort To Try To Settle Race Trouble In the South.

ATLANTA, Ga., May 31.—Two great movements looking towards the solution of the race problem in the South, especially in Georgia, have been launched and have gained the support of some of the most prominent men in the country, according to a statement made by the conference of the Atlantic Evangelical Ministers' association. One movement is being urged by Dr. John E. White, pastor of the first Baptist church, who reported to the conference that it is gaining great headway.

"Five of the wealthiest men in the South," Dr. White stated, "have put all they have back of this movement. We contemplate the organization of all the moral forces of the South in one great body and the appointment of a commission composed of the best and most learned men of the South to handle the problem and deal with the situation affecting the relationship of the races."

POLICE TO WATCH TRAIN SHARPEERS
