The annual meeting of the Excelsior Farmers Institute of York will be held in York Hall on Friday, December 20th, 1907, at 7 o'clock p. m.

An alarm of fire sounded yesterday afternoon. It called the firemen out for a slight blaze in the home of John McGee, in the eastern part of the City.

Rev. C. W. Hamilton, at one time stationed as Methodist minister in this Province, recently held a successful series of special services in Little River, N. B., with good success.

The Maritime Merchant says: Orders for spring generally are reported good, and Prince Edward Island seems to be turning in particularly good orders. One traveller has reported the best business he has ever done on the Island.

The St. John's papers referred with much sorrow to the death of Walter S. March at St. John's on the 22nd ult, aged 35 years. He was a native of Bay of Islands, a young man of sterling character and literary ability. He was married to Florence only daughter of Rev. Dr. Cowperthwaite who is well known throughout this Province.

The report of the management of last fall's exhibition at Fredericton, shows that there was a small surplus. The total expenditure was \$16,301.13, and there is still a few small premiums to pay. The receipts were \$16,295.03, with some \$300 still due. The surplus will be about \$300. The amount paid in premiums was nearly \$6,000, of which New Brunswick exhibitors received \$3,723.50; Nova Scotia, \$1,395.75; and Prince Edward Island, \$842.25--Maritime Merchant.

At Wonderland last night large audiences were entertained with a moving picture program that was both edifying and entertaining. Particularly instructive was the splendid film showing scenes and incidents in connection with the late fighting between the French and the Moors. The comics pleased everyone, and music and song completed the pleasant program. The hall has been thoroughly scrubbed and fumigated, etc., and is now wholesome, clean and well ventilated.

The morning service at the First Methodist Church tomorrow will be of special interest to children and parents, it being the Sunday on which the Christmas Gifts for the poor are made. The executive have decided that the children of the school should have a service devoted to them. A special choir for children will lead the service of praise and a short address suitable to the occasion will take the place of the regular sermon. The afternoon service at 3 o'clock has a special program of songs, readings and concert exercises. The service will be in the body of the church. Parents and guardians are especially invited to both services. Children will sit with their relatives or friends at the morning service. The school will meet as usual at 2.30 and march up into the body of the church.

Pork is easier, says the Maritime Merchant, of Halifax, owing to lower prices in Prince Edward Island, and there are fair supplies coming forward from day to day. Fowl of all kinds are fairly plentiful and at present prices here should be a large Xmas trade.

Dressed hogs on market yesterday brought from 7 to 7 1/2 c for the best quality, thin hogs being refused at almost any price. Davis & Fraser are sending letters to their buyers throughout the Island saying they notice a large percentage of the hogs arriving the last few days are of very inferior quality, showing insufficient fattening,--quite a few are practically worthless. In future they will return every thin hog they receive from them. They regret having to do so, but can see that the quality is deteriorating to an alarming extent each year, and unless hogs are better fed, the end of the industry here is not far distant. It appears as if hog-risers are resting on the reputation earned for Prince Edward Island pork, which was gained in the days when some attention was paid to the proper feeding of hogs. An underfed hog will not produce good meat, the flesh being stringy and unpalatable, and hard to dispose of. It seems a pity if such pork is to displace the hitherto excellent article raised in this province.
