S' side Council Considering Parking Meters

Serious consideration is being given by the Summerside Town Council to installing parking meters on Water Street, it was learned yesterday from Mayor J. Frank Arnett. Mr. W. B. Currie of Jones Electric N. S. Ltd. of Halifax was in Summerside yesterday and gave a demonstration of the use of parking meters to Mayor Arnett, Councilor Henry Wedge, chairman of the street department, and other councillors and civic officials. The parking problem on Water Street has been a serious one for a number of years and it has been aggravated this year by the moving of the Vendor shop to a busy section of the street. Various means to alleviate the situation have been tried but none of them have shown very substantial results.

It is claimed that parking meters eliminate the use of the street by some motorists for lengthy periods which prohibits the average shopper from finding parking space. Five coppers or a five cent piece will permit a motorist to park for an hour. Usually when parking meters are installed the police department conducts an extensive educational program for about thirty days before they are strictly enforced. It is understood that over forty municipalities in Canada have adopted them.—S.
