BIG SEIZURE OF FISH MADE BY CANADA GOV'T

Near Sault Ste. Marie--Biggest Fish Seizure in Dominion's History

SAULT STE MARIE, Nov. 21—(Special)—The biggest fish seizure in the history of the Dominion was made today by officers at Killarney and other places near the Soo. Tugs and fish belonging to Purvis Bros. and other fishermen valued at one hundred thousand dollars were seized, and wholesale prosecutions are expected.

A HOT FIGHT IN MONCTON ON SCOTT ACT

Hotel keepers And Bar Tenders Nearly All Under Sentence, But Magistrate's Jurisdiction to Imprison Is Appealed To Supreme Court

MONCTON, Nov. 21—(Special)—Moncton is witnessing the most severe enforcement of the Canada Temperance Act in a decade. Nearly every hotel keeper and bartender in the city is under sentence of a month's imprisonment, but the sentence is not being enforced for the time being, as the question of the magistrate's jurisdiction to impose it is before the Supreme Court of New Brunswick.

STAGE GIRLS CAPTURING THE BRITISH PEERS

Thanks to Dulness of Society Misses— Viola Tree Destined to be Duchess of Rutland— Marquis of Anglesea and Earl of Stanhope

LONDON, Nov. 20—The World correspondent hears of three more important alliances between stage folk and the peerage. The most important is that of Viola Tree, daughter of Beerholm Tree, to Lord Granby, eldest son and heir of the Duke and Duchess of Rutland. The present Duchess of Rutland and Mrs. Tree are the closest of friends. Viola Tree is the first actress from the legitimate stage to win a peer. Hitherto British aristocrats have fallen in love only with showgirls.

SOME RECORD FINES IN SCOTT ACT CASES

McAdam Junction Man Must Pay \$900— Option Thirty Days In Jail

FREDERICTON, Nov. 20.—Thomas W. Nicholson, of McAdam Junction, against whom were fifteen Scott act cases, was yesterday found guilty by Police Magistrate Marsh on all the charges. As each fine is \$50, the total fines come to \$750. The costs amount to about \$150.

GERMANY TO BUILD TWELVE DREADNAUGHTS

Will Lay Down Three Big Battleships and One 19,000 Cruiser

BERLIN, Nov. 20.—The imperial navy estimates provide for the outlay in 1908 of \$85,000,000, which is \$15,000,000 more than in 1907. There will be a progressive increase in the estimates, until in 1912 they will reach \$97,500,000. During the next four years Germany will lay down annually three battleships as large as the British Dreadnought and a huge armored cruiser similar to the 19,000-ton ship now building at Hamburg.

Britain was the only safe spot, he continued, because financial and fiscal heresy did not find a home within her shores.
