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

WHICH IS THE CIVILIZED POWER?

Under the above caption George Kennan in The Outlook discusses the relative educational, moral, religious and political status of Japan and Russia. In Japan education is widely diffused. Tokio has a bookstore on almost every block. There are ten bookstores in Tokio for every one in St. Petersburg. Russia has but 25 per cent of her children of school age actually at school; Japan has 92 per cent. Russia spends 8 cents per capita of her whole population on education; Japan 34 cents.

In Russia more than half the primary schools are devoted chiefly to religion, the catechism and church singing. Reading and writing are mere incidentals. Submission, reverence and loyalty to the Czar and devotion to the church are chiefly inculcated. In Japan the teaching is founded on reason, as outlined in an imperial rescript to students: "Be filial to your parents and affectionate to your brothers; be loving husbands and wives and true to your friends; conduct yourself with all modesty and be benevolent to all. Develop your intellectual faculties and perfect your moral powers by gaining knowledge and acquiring a profession. Promote public interest and advance public affairs. Ever respect the national constitution, and obey the laws of the country and in case of necessity courageously sacrifice yourselves to the public good."

Then as to religious toleration. In most civilized countries a man is free not only to worship God according to his conscience but to recommend his own particular faith to others. In Russia this is not so. Missionaries are not tolerated; attempts to proselyte are punished with penal servitude. Marriages of children of Bible students are driven out of the country or banished to Siberia. Japan, on the contrary is dotted with Christian missions, and religious thought, belief and instruction have long been as free as they are in Canada or the British Isles. While Japan is at war with Russia the doctrines of the Greek Church, the national and intolerant religion of Russia, is fully taught in Japan by whosoever will. And this even through Russian ecclesiastics teach that the "Mikado is the Anti Christ." Could toleration go further than this?

For the Czar there is no law but his own will. He may and does from time to time grant permission to his favorites or officials to set aside any law. Thus no one knows what the law is under which he may be punished. Public meetings may not be held without official permission. The signing of a collective petition to the Czar or to a Minister is a penal offence. A man may not change his residence or even his boarding place without notifying the police. In Japan the Emperor is bound by the constitution and

by the laws made by Parliament and the laws bear equally upon all. House searches by the police, arbitrary arrests and sentences of exile are unknown. Citizens are not hampered by a passport system; they are at liberty to go where and when they like, read what they choose, think and talk as they please and act freely within the widest possible limits of law, as we in Canada do.

We cannot follow all the contrasts set forth by Mr. Kennan, but briefly summarize a few of the many. As to individual and national integrity Mr. Kennan finds Russian officialdom notoriously corrupt. He admits that the standard of commercial morality in the treaty ports of Japan is far from high. At the same time business upon an immense scale is being carried on honestly, and there are no scandals in the public service. "And when it comes to a comparison between Russia and Japan in the matter of political truthfulness, sincerity and honor, the Asiatic power stands far higher than the European." And he finds an equally great contrast as to the modesty, morality and humanity of the two nations. Judged by examples it is easy to decide which of the two is the more "civilized."

A Great Whale Hunt.

The London Field describes a whale hunt in Shetland when several hundred of the animals appeared in the bay while all of the men and most of the women were away herding fishing.

Several boats, however, went out, one of them being that of the schoolmistress, who was accompanied by some of her pupils. The boats succeeded in driving a large number of whales ashore. "I had nothing but an old bayonet," says the writer, "and getting it, the work of spearing was entered upon till no fewer than eighty-six whales were secured.
