HALIFAX, April 26—Although the cable steamer Mackay-Bennett has been at sea for over a week and has reported that she has recovered over 200 bodies of the victims of the Titanic disaster no definite news was obtainable at an early hour this morning as to when she would return to Halifax.

To Halifax the civilized world is turning in an effort to discover just what bodies have been recovered and to this end many persons who lost friends in the catastrophe are either in the city or now on their way here.

Workmen are everywhere steadily engaged and the only difference with regard to a general scarcity of reported, in farm labor, particularly in Western Canada.
