Some two years ago he preached morning and evening in the First Methodist Church in this City on which occasion very large congregations were deeply impressed and pleased with his ministrations, and we doubt not that many will read with interest the discourses he has consented to supply through The Guardian, beginning next Saturday.

The committee of the House of Commons to whom the Daylight Bill was submitted have reported in its favor. The bill as it stands provides that from the first Sunday in April 1910 the clock shall be set ahead one hour and so remain till the first Sunday in November following. The committee communicated with many municipalities and boards of trade in regard to the bill with the result that 19 boards of trade and 30 municipalities approve of it, while seven municipalities are opposed or doubtful.
