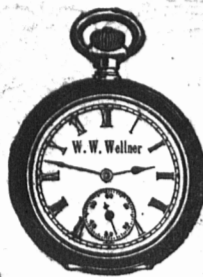

**Robert E. Smith**, formerly of Queen Square School has been appointed Principal of the High School at Hanksinon, North Dakota.

The Executive of the Baptist Young People's Union of the Maritime Provinces have offered to pay for the support of a missionary in India.

The ice is reported much looser in the Straits during the past two days owing to the favorable winds and the boats made excellent crossings yesterday. The mails arrived in the city at two o'clock. Owing to heavy wind there was no crossing at the Capes.

Some parts of P. E. Island report last Friday night the coldest of the season. The thermometer registered 17 below. If this is the Island's lowest marking for the season, the Islanders may consider themselves very fortunate. They have been having very mild weather compared with the experience of the mainland inhabitants.—Moncton Times.

**Capt. J. H. Pratt**, of the government fishery service, with two men from his crew on the S. S. Curlew, and **Capt. Kent**, of Grand Manan, with two men, left last evening for Quebec. **Capt. Knowlton**, of PARSBORO, with two men, were to join the others at Moncton. All will take a short course in gunnery at the citadel.—St. John Telegraph.

Several settlers along the coast between Campbellton and Cape Wolfe, P. E. I., aver that on two different occasions during the month of January, this year, the severity of which is indelibly engraved upon the minds of all, the straits were entirely frozen over between that portion of the Island's shore and Richibucto.

**Rev. Dr. D. J. Fraser**, pastor of St. Stephen's church, St. John and a native of Alberton, P. E. I., and **Hon. J. G. Forbes** have been appointed by the general assembly of the Presbyterian church in Canada delegates from New Brunswick to the Pan-Canadian Alliance (Eg.) Representatives from all the reformed churches in Europe, America and Australia will be there. Both of these gentlemen were in attendance at the Presbyterian Synod which met in Charlottetown last fall.

The Centenary Anniversary of the British and Foreign Bible Society will be celebrated throughout Christendom on tomorrow, Sunday, and Monday the 7th. Services will be held in Charlottetown as follows:—Mass meeting of Sunday Schools in the First Methodist Church on Sunday the 6th at 3.30 p. m. Sermons in all the churches at one of the services on Sunday. Public meeting on Monday evening at 8 o'clock in Zion Church. Collections at all services in aid of the funds of the Society.

**Capt. A. H. Anderson** formerly of the 3rd R. C. R. here and now at the head of the ordinance Department at Charlottetown, is in the city and leaves today for Charlottetown. When the captain settled in his new appointment at Charlottetown his father and mother were taken also from Lunenburg, but some weeks ago the old gentleman who was 79 years of age, contracted a cold, which he did not think serious, but which led to his death. The body was brought to Lunenburg for interment, **Capt. Anderson** and his mother coming with it. The steamer they were on was stuck in the ice for some days. **Mrs. Anderson** is here with her son and returns to Charlottetown with him.—Halifax Chronicle.

The lobster fisherman is again preparing to follow his vocation when the icy barriers that now encircle our shores shall have disappeared. Some new additions to our fleet of lobster will be made this season and the speed of the as yet untitled new ones form an interesting and perhaps profitable theme for discussion.—The neighborhood of the interesting locality known to local fame as **Lady Smith** was the scene of some stirring events lately, that some of the actors will bear in memory for some time. Some young men made an evening call at a dwelling, from which the proprietor and his wife had gone on an evening visit, but while enjoying themselves as a happy company a besieging army took possession and barricaded the entrances so effectually that thearrison were hopelessly imprisoned until the hours of the night had grown large, when a relieving force (the proprietor,) who was almost less welcome to the prisoners than the besiegers, appeared on the scene and relieved them from their predicament. The speed with which they left that neighborhood can only be judged by the distance between their tracks in the snow. We have not heard yet when the next call will be made.

**FEBRUARY TEMPERATURE.**

Meteorological Office, Charlottetown.  
The month of February just ended has shown itself to be a colder month than the preceding one—January. On 16 days the temperature fell below zero, the lowest being 18 degrees and one-tenth below and the mean temperature for the month reaching only eleven degrees and one-tenth above zero.  
Though a very cold month and considered by some to be unprecedented it is in reality not so, for I have been shown by **Mr. Cundall** the daily records of February, 1888, which show 17 days at and below zero, and only on one day, the last day of the month, was the temperature above the freezing point. The lowest recorded during that month was 11 below zero and the mean temperature was only nine degrees and nine-tenths above zero.
