**SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH WEST LAND REGULATIONS.**  
ANY person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years of age, may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta, in Manitoba, must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any agency, on certain conditions, by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of intending homesteader.  
Duties—Six months residence upon land and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 50 acres solely owned and occupied by him or by his father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister.  
In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section alongside his homestead. Price \$3.00 per acre.  
Duties—Must reside upon the homestead or pre-emption six months in each of three years from date of homestead entry (including the time required to carry homestead patent) and cultivate fifty acres extra.  
A homesteader who has exhausted his homestead right and cannot obtain a homestead in certain districts, may pre-empt an acre—Duties—Must reside six months on each of three years, cultivate fifty acres and erect a house worth \$200.

Our Inspector adds 'I find a great improvement in the handling. The percentage of broken boxes is very small and will not average over 3 per cent. The above inspector has been stationed at Halifax during the fall and winter seasons for several years past and it is gratifying to learn that the cheese are now handled so carefully as is indicated by the very small percentage of breakage.'"
