The Report Of The Directors For The Past Year—Resolution Passed—Small Deficit

The Directors submitted their report as follows:—The Directors in submitting their Annual Report congratulate the shareholders on the success of the Seventh Inter-Provincial Exhibition held on their grounds in October last.

Princess Beatrice, youngest daughter of the late Duke of Saxe-Coburg Gotha (formerly Duke of Edinburgh), and therefore a niece of King Edward is betrothed to Alfonso, of Bourbon-Orleans.
